celebrations are wonderful opportunities to come together as a community and enjoy one another’s company.

This past Thursday was a special day for us in the United States as we witnessed the beatification of Archbishop Fulton Sheen. He was a unique figure in the history of the Church in our country. He was an author and speaker and became a household name through his nationally televised program, *Life Is Worth Living*, which even won an Emmy Award.

Yet, behind all his public ministry was a deep life of prayer. He encouraged a daily Holy Hour, especially for clergy, and modeled this himself by giving the Lord one of the first hours of his day, no matter how full his schedule might be. That prayer fed his ministry, and the insights he received in prayer were then shared with the countless people who listened to him.

My mother credits Archbishop Sheen with encouraging her parents’ devotion to the Rosary and the Church. They attended one of his rallies and were very much impressed by his encouragement to pursue holiness. For this, I am thankful. It is a reminder that we never know how something we say or do in service of the Lord may affect another person—or even generations that come after us.

Blessed Fulton Sheen also demonstrates a challenge to us priests as we deal with altar servers. As a young server, Fulton dropped a cruets while serving for a bishop. The bishop was kind and after Mass told Fulton that someday he will be a bishop. Around the same time, another young server dropped the cruets, and the priest struck him. That young man was Josop Broz, who later became an atheist and was known as Tito, the communist dictator who persecuted many, including priests.

With his beatification, Blessed Fulton Sheen will join a small group of U.S. born men who have been beatified, including Blessed Stanley Rother, Blessed Solanus Casey, Blessed Michael McGivney, Blessed Brother James Miller, and Blessed Carlos Manuel Rodríguez of Puerto Rico. The Church also honors a number of men who served heroically in the United States but were born elsewhere. At present, there are no U.S. born men who have been canonized saints, although there are several U.S. born women who have been canonized.

The Church continues to discern the lives of many other men and women, including here in Minnesota. In fact, the Diocese of Duluth is formally opening the cause for canonization of Monsignor Joseph Buh, the missionary priest who served throughout northern Minnesota in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

May the examples of these men and women remind us that holiness is not reserved for a select few. God calls each of us to holiness. Let us pray for many more men and women—including ourselves—to respond generously to that call and to serve the Lord faithfully in whatever circumstances He has placed us.

LYON COUNTY MUSEUM PROGRAM

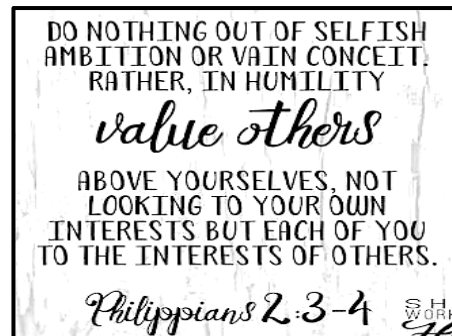
Living (and Fighting) in the Bishop's New Colony: St. Eloi's First Thirty Years

Anita Gaul will present this program at the Lyon County Museum, 301 West Lyon Street, Marshall on Tuesday, September 29 at 6:30 pm.

Bishop John Ireland of St. Paul established ten Catholic colonies in western Minnesota from 1876-1883, including Ghent. Although the Bishop envisioned his colonies to be harmonious and prosperous settlements, Ghent's new St. Eloi parish experienced great turmoil as the Flemish and French-Canadian Catholics attempted to build a church.

Dr. Gaul explores the fractious relationship between St. Eloi's ethnic groups and the reasons why they were able to continue worshipping together in the same parish.

The program is free and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served.

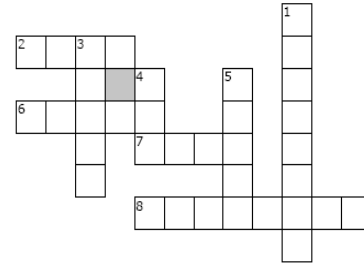
