- If there is not space on this page sufficient to contain the names of all the children in the district, write the remainder upon the blanks 2a, provided for this purpose. If these blanks have not been furnished you, apply to your commissioner. Census lists copied on any but the prescribed blanks will not be accepted.
- The ages of the children must be given as they are on May 31, 1920. If a child removes from the district during the fifteen days preceding June 1, he should be enrolled in the district in which he is resident May 31, 1920.
