Please read scholarship descriptions carefully and select **NO MORE than FIVE**.
Awardees will receive a maximum of one scholarship

1. Kiwanis Club of Santa Maria Past Presidents' Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): A \$1,500 Scholarship is awarded to a college, junior college, or vocational bound student. In the great tradition of Kiwanis service, applicants who sacrifice personal time for the betterment of the greater good will be given special consideration, as will students who have held a leadership position in a student organization. Criteria may also include academic achievement.

2. Kiwanis for Kids Fred Homann Fine Arts Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): A \$1,500 Fine Arts Scholarship being offered by Kiwanis for Kids in honor of Fred Homann to music and fine arts students. This scholarship may be used at any accredited college, junior college, or vocational college. A foundation goal is to culturally enrich our community. Awardee will pursue a career in fine or performing arts.

3. Kiwanis for Kids Scholarships (GPA min 3.0): A \$1,500 Scholarship being offered by Kiwanis for Kids. This scholarship may be used at any accredited college or junior college. Applicants should have completed a minimum of 100 hours of community service during their high school years.

4. Kiwanis for Kids Scholarship in Honor of Robert Morrison (GPA min 3.0): A \$1,500 scholarship is offered to a student who has excelled in community service. The recipient will pursue a career in communications. Bob worked as a broadcaster and in advertising. He has been a member of Kiwanis for Fifty years. A few years ago Bob moved to Georgia to be closer to his daughter. He still attends our meetings by Zoom. Throughout the years Bob has worked endlessly for the betterment of the children in the Santa Maria Valley.

5. Kiwanis for Kids Key Club Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): A \$2,000 scholarship is offered to two students who have been an active member of Key club a minimum of three years including their senior year. Emphasis will be placed on community service and leadership education.

6. Aktion Club of Santa Maria Scholarship (GPA min 2.0): A \$1,000 scholarship award will be presented to a student with a minimum 2.0 average GPA and a physical or mental disability or someone pursuing a career that will benefit people with disabilities. The Aktion Club of Santa Maria is a service organization sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Santa Maria. Members of the Aktion Club are adults with various types of disabilities who work together to strengthen and improve our community. Qualified applicants must plan to attend any level of college, vocational training, or trade school after high school graduation.

7. SMHS Garrett Jason Galvez Memorial Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): A \$1500 scholarships is offered to two **Santa Maria High School** graduates who participated in sports and extra-curricular activities. This scholarship may be used for attendance at any accredited college, or junior college. Ideal candidates are scholar athletes and must state in an essay the sport or activity that he or she participated in and its impact on them, as well as having participated in community service events. This scholarship is offered in memory of Garrett J. Galvez, who was a scholar athlete and 1989 graduate of SMHS, but who died tragically in May, 1990.

8. McInerney Family Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): (Three \$1000 Scholarships) A \$1,000 scholarship is offered to (3) college or junior college bound high school students who have also graduated from **Arellanes Junior High School**. Sponsored by Bill and Tiffany Fife McInerney. Criteria for award includes academic achievement (GPA, awards), community service, and difficult economic circumstances.

9. Moats Family Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): (Two \$1000 Scholarships) \$1,000 scholarship is offered to a college or junior college bound student who is pursuing a path into the medical field. Sponsored by Dr. Michael and Susan Moats. Award criteria include academic achievement (GPA, awards), community service, & difficult economic circumstances.

10. Kiwanis STEM Scholarship, sponsored by the Healy and Prezkop families (GPA min 3.0): A \$1500 scholarship is offered to a student bound for a 2 year or 4 year college. Preference will be given to a student who intends to pursue a degree in Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM). Criteria include academic achievement in related fields and an emphasis on community service.

11. Felipe and Virginia Guzman Memorial Scholarship: (GPA min 3.0): Sponsored by Elaine C. Guzman. This \$1,000 scholarship is being awarded to a high school student who will be attending either Jr. College or a 4-year State of University College program. This student will exhibit academic success, be a first generation college student for their family and have an economic need. Preference will be given to students who have actively participated in K-Kids, Builder's Club or Key Club.

12. Art Guzman Memorial Scholarship: (GPA min 3.0): This \$1,000 scholarship is being awarded to a high school student who embodies a record of having demonstrated a willingness to be helpful via community volunteer involvement, with an emphasis in youth and community recreation. Someone looking to enter a professional career that focuses on serving the community and has a strong academic record, with participation in High School extra-curricular activities, such as student government, social clubs and sports.

13. Bob and Jane Dixon Memorial Scholarship: (GPA min 3.0): This \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a college or junior college bound student. Criteria for this scholarship is based on their community service, economic need and academic achievement. This scholarship is in memory of long-time Kiwanian Bob Dixon, whose service to Kiwanis and the community is still felt today.

14. Santa Maria High School Class of 1970 Scholarship: (GPA min 3.0): The Santa Maria High School Class of 1970 will be awarding one scholarship in the amount of \$1,970 to a graduating student who meets the following requirements. The recipient of the scholarship must: 1. be a graduating student from **Santa Maria High School** in Santa Maria, California; 2. plan to attend a California public college or university (community college, California State University or University of California.); 3. have at least two years of participation in extracurricular school activities, e.g. school clubs, student government, sports, band or choral music, cheerleading, etc; 4. have a financial need for assistance and 5. complete and submit the Kiwanis scholarship application by the established deadline.

15. Alex and Julie Posada Scholarship (GPA min 3.0): A \$1,000 scholarship is offered to a student who has experienced a hardship growing up and persevered with college as their future goal.

16. John "Jack" Guhring Memorial Scholarship (GPA min 3.5): A \$1,000 scholarship is offered to a high school **female** senior student who will be pursuing a degree in Business or STEM with a well rounded education and part-time work experience. She must have at least 100 hours service as well as involvement in extracurricular activities. All high schools in Santa Maria Valley are eligible.

17. Coastal Valley Cyber Kiwanis Technical/Trade Certification Scholarship (GPA no min, High School Diploma required): A \$1000 scholarship is offered to a student who plans to go to a trade school certification program after graduating high school. This scholarship will not be awarded to a student going to a four-year college. Submit one-page essay identifying certificate you will receive when completed and why you need the scholarship. What are your long-term career dreams? Describe your community activities.

18. Golden State Water Technical/Trade Degree or Certification Scholarship (GPA min 2.5): A \$1,000 scholarship is offered to a student who will be pursuing a technical or trades degree or certification from an accredited college or program. The award is for a student not planning on continuing to a four year college. Rather the recipient's goal would be pursuing a career in his or her chosen technical field, vocation, or trade. Examples include nursing, welding, auto repair, public safety, culinary arts, early childhood education, etc.

19. Technical/Trade Degree or Certification Scholarship (GPA min 2.5): A \$1,000 scholarship is offered to a student who will be pursuing a technical or trades degree or certification from an accredited college or program. The award is for a student not planning on continuing to a four year college. Rather the recipient's goal would be pursuit of a career in his or her chosen technical field, vocation, or trade. Examples include nursing, welding, auto repair, public safety, culinary arts, early childhood education, etc.

20. Central City Culinary Scholarship (GPA 3.0): A \$1,000 Scholarship for a high school graduate enrolled in a culinary institution. Essay should include experiences, why you want to pursue culinary arts. Bonus points will be given if you want to return to the Santa Maria area to start your career. What influences can you share and what motivated you towards culinary arts.
