I would like to take this opportunity to highlight a few of the happening throughout our district. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

**Solar Project:** Our solar field will be installed and is tentatively scheduled to be completed by the end of December. The solar field will be located on the southwest corner of the school property. It will cover 2 acres of unusable land and will provide approximately 62% of our electricity at a reduced cost. This is at no cost to our General Fund. We're extremely grateful to Thom Blake and the Entrust Co. for their generous donation of this project to our district. It will no doubt save us a lot of money in energy costs for decades to come. We're also working with Entrust on upgrading all of our interior lighting to LED in the 1995 gymnasium. We will reap instantaneous savings from that change. Our goal is always to upgrade in ways that are more energy efficient and will cut costs, but also keep our facility functioning at the best level possible. We have such wonderful facilities of which the community is immensely proud, and we want to maintain it appropriately while still being good stewards of taxpayer dollars.

Construction Update: We are in the final stage of the construction process of the new K-12 building. While the building has been occupied for over a year, we are working diligently to address any construction issues prior to closing out the project. If everything goes according to plan, the project will be closed out this fall. It's a beautiful building and something the Liberty Center Community should be very proud of for many years to come. We anticipate left-over funds from the project. These funds will be used to build a new restroom facility for the varsity football field. More details

about this project will be forthcoming.

## **Veteran's Memorial Project:**

The construction of a new Veteran's Memorial at the corner of Young St. and St. Rt. 109 is nearing completion. The Liberty Center Education Foundation sold over 200 pavers to be installed as part of this project. This will be an attractive cornerstone to the school property and will serve as great tribute to the brave men and women that lost their lives serving our Great Country.

## **Chromebooks for Grades 6-12**

Students must have a signed (by parent) Chromebook Agreement, \$20.00 deposit, and be present to get their Chromebook. If a student does not want to take his/her Chromebook home during the school year, no insurance deposit is needed. Chromebooks can be picked up during schedule and packet pickup times.

#### **School Fees**

School fees for Kindergarten, 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 are \$50.00 per student. Grade 4 student fees are \$55.00 per student, which will allow the fourth graders to keep their recorders from music class. Middle School and High School fees will be mailed home with first quarter grade cards.

## **Get your Athletic Pass!**

Athletic Passes and Senior Citizen Passes will be on sale at Open House on August 19<sup>th</sup> from 4:30-6:00 in the Auditeria. They will also be sold on Monday and Tuesday, August 19<sup>th</sup>- 20<sup>th</sup> from 9:00-12:00 and 1:00-4:00 in the Athletic Office (located in the Administrative Building).
