HEALTH NEWS

Dear Nautilus Family.
I would like to thank everyone for their diligence with our ongoing problem with COVID. Please remember that if anyone in your household is getting tested and waiting for results to please keep your students at home until you get results. Another topic I would like to cover is 11 year old immunizations. When your student turns 11 they are due for a Tdap and Meningococcal immunization. These shots are due two weeks after they turn 11. If they can't be done at the birthday, notifying the nurse of the appointment date will do. You may elect to be exempt also. Please call me at 928-505-6020.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

The student drop-off and pick-up system at Nautilus is effective and safe when everyone follows the procedures!

The following are some “tips” to use the system more effectively!

- Please drop off students at the green curb at ANY point where you have stopped. Do not wait to be at the front of the drop off line to drop them off.
- Have students enter/exit the right side of the vehicle, if possible, as the left side is a driving lane.
- Please pull into the left lane when students have exited or entered the vehicle, to allow others to move forward and drop off their students. When students are “dropped off” in the right lane, drivers may pull into the left lane and continue on their way. Las Vegas schools call this set-up the “kiss and go lane”! Parents give their child a “kiss” as they leave the car each morning and then “go” on to their workday!
- Park in the parking lot if your child needs help exiting the vehicle or you want to make sure they go into the building.

The following practices take away from the system’s effectiveness – and even compromise safety!

- “Cutting/walking” across the kiss and go lanes or parking exit lanes to walk your child to the building, instead of using the supervised crosswalk.
- Dropping students off in the “driving lanes” of the parking lot.
- Dropping off/Picking up in the bus parking area.
- Waiting to be “first” in the “green curb” line, and not dropping children off upon reaching the “green curb” sidewalk.
- Remaining in the kiss and go lanes to watch a child enter the building.
- Not pulling into the left lane when able to do so after dropping off students.
- Early arrival and waiting in the pickup line for the end of the day dismissal.

Parents Right to Know
Title I School-Wide Programs
Parents’ Right to Know Notice

Dear Parents or Guardians:

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child’s teacher. Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
