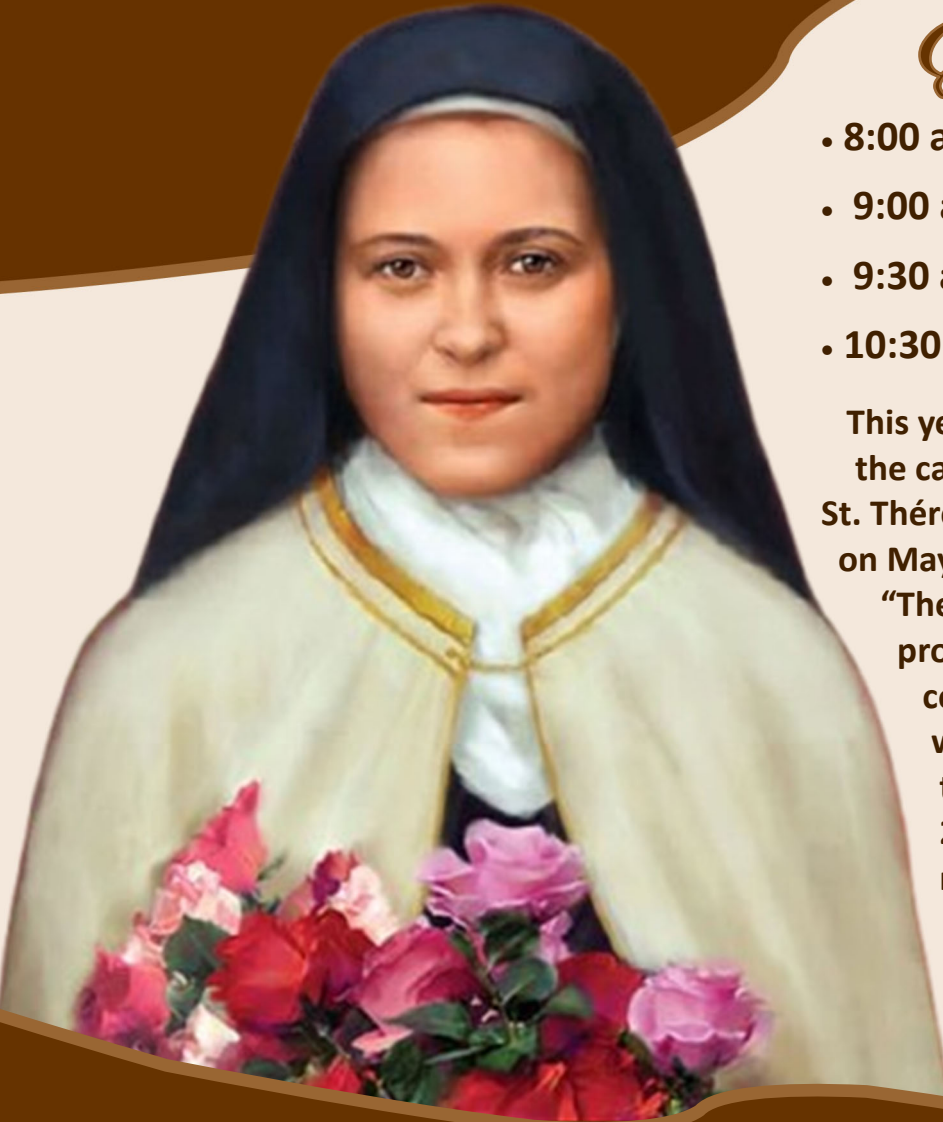


Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Canonization of St. Therese on Saturday, May 17, 2025
