Imagine for a moment someone does something that makes you very angry... an argument with a friend, someone yelling at you, someone yelling at you, someone yelling at you, someone yelling at you, someone with you. And imagine your typical reaction - your automatic pilot reaction. What do you say, how do you act, do you yell, swear, say things you later regret? Imagine yourself having any of those reactions.

Now back up and imagine the situation again but from the point before you respond. First consider where you feel anger in your body. See if you can identify where it is. Also notice the thoughts associated with this anger. Are they thoughts of revenge, hatred, hurt, disappointment?

With the time it takes to notice all those things, you have created space between the situation and your typical reaction happen so quickly we don't have any space in between. It's like they are glued together. But when you bring awareness to a situation, you can often create enough space between the situation and the reaction that the reaction becomes a response, a thoughtful choice, a calmer choice, a choice with a better outcome.
