## **Community Building & School Climate**

### **Start with Hello Week**

Schaghticoke continues to emphasize kind, responsible, and safe actions. As part of this continued work, students and staff participated in Start with Hello Week from September 18 through 22. Start with Hello week is part of the Sandy Hook Promise.

Each year, thousands of schools throughout the country participate in the Start with Hello program. The goal of the program is to teach students empathy, and empower students to end social isolation through three steps: see someone alone, reach out and help, and start by saying hello.

In addition to daily morning announcements tailored to Start with Hello Week, there was a daily theme. The themes for each day were, Meet-n-Greet Monday, Upstander Tuesday, Wear Green Wednesday, Trusted Adult Thursday, And Moving Forward Friday. During Thursday's activity, students created notes of gratitude to adults who they view as trusted adults at SMS.

### **SMS Celebrates Unity Day**

On Wednesday, October 18th, SMS celebrated Unity Day as part of Bullying Prevention Month. All students and staff were encouraged to wear orange and sign a pledge to help stop bullying. The pledge encourages students to make a commitment to: support others that have been hurt or harmed, treat others with kindness, be more accepting of our differences, and work to include others that may have been left out.

### **Social-Emotional Learning @ SMS**

The SMS community continues to work to foster a sense of community through SEL lessons during FLEX, morning announcements from first period classes, weekly spirit days, and by promoting student discourse, problem solving, and team building across all classes and extracurricular activities. Pictured in this piece are students from Robotics Club working collaboratively to build a robot, students in science class making and sharing observations about nutrient cycles during Science class, students sit in a circle and talk during FLEX/Advisory, Minions and Gru doing the morning announcements, and students from Team 7 Blue take time to plant tulips to beautify the SMS grounds and add to our ecosystem during a unit about cycles in nature.

Additionally, Mrs. Quader and her students recently designed and installed a new bulletin board at SMS. The theme of the bulletin board is "Today is a good day to..." Each of the colorful cards around these words describes a positive behavior/mindset, or shares a way we can all be positive members of the Schaghticoke and greater New Milford communities. Examples include "be brave," "be a leader," "finish something," and "be kind." Thank you so much to Mrs. Quader and her students for helping to bring such positive messages to the halls at SMS!

### **Athletics @ SMS**

While it took a while to get the fall sports season underway due to the weather, athletes and coaches at SMS have been hard at work! Student athletes are participating in soccer, cross country, and soccer. Flag football is also getting underway more recently. Through these sports, students are learning the fundamentals of the sport and reinforcing the skills necessary for teamwork, all while having fun with peers and adults.



Students and staff have been working collaboratively to design and install new window displays in the LMC. This month the windows were designed by Jameson & Kaitlyn. One window is dedicated to Halloween and the stories that relate to this spooky holiday. The other window is dedicated to other fall holidays such as Diwali, Thanksgiving, Veterans Day, and Rosh Hashanah. Great job Jameson & Kaitlyn!

### 8th Grade Field Trip

Students in the 8th grade recently traveled to the Eric Sloane Museum, Kent Furnace, and the Connecticut Antique Machinery Foundation, all located in Kent, Connecticut. This trip helped to enrich 8th grade curricular offerings, while also promoting team building. The Eric Sloane Museum was a chance for students to extend their knowledge of memoirs, which is the first unit in the ELA 8 curriculum, as well as to view first hand some of the early tools that are associated with their student of American History in 8th grade Social Studies. Also tying into the 8th grade Social Studies and Science curricula were Kent Furnace, where students learned about iron mining and smelting in Litchfield County, and the Connecticut Antique Machinery Association where students experienced
