

Dear Parents,

We have some FABULOUS NEWS! North Lake School has been able to purchase the A/R Reading program for this school year. Below you will find the points your child will be expected to meet and the cutoff dates. If your child meets their points goal at the end of the dates below, they will receive a reward. If they reach their goal **every time**, there will be a special activity for them.

- Below you will find points your child will need to reach for each Reading Period.

Kindergarten- Reading Period 1- 20 books Reading Period 2 -25 books Reading Period 3- 30 books Reading Period 4- 35 books	3rd grade Reading Period 1- 6 pts Reading Period 2 - 6 pts Reading Period 3- 7 pts Reading Period 4- 7 pts

- For each student to meet their goal at the end of each Reading Period, they must earn their allotted points and maintain an 80% on comprehension. They can read 1 level below their grade level. For example a Second Grader can read a 1st grade level book. (Some situations may be allowed to read above grade level, but will have to be approved by their teacher)
- We will have four Reading Periods. Below you will find the last day for testing and the activities we have planned.

1) October 3rd last day for testing -Popcorn	2) December 13th last day for testing -Pizza
3) March 1st last day for testing -Cotton Candy	4) April 30th last day for testing -Slushie
A Special activity will be awarded to those students who meet every Reading Period Goal.	

Working to make each and every child a success is our goal. Please make sure your child reads at home, understands what they are reading, and writes down their book titles so they can take an A/R test the next day. Allow older children to have a certain time in their afternoon/night to read for enjoyment. By doing this, we can create a positive habit. If we work together, their reading skills will blossom.
