COVID-19 is primarily spread from person-to-person and people typically become infected by coming in close contact (within 6 feet) with a person with COVID-19. You can become infected from respiratory droplets when a person with COVID-19 coughs, sneeze or talks.

It is also possible to get COVID-19 by touching a surface that has the virus on it and then touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Symptoms of COVID-19 include, but are not limited to, fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, muscle aches, fatigue, headaches, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and decreased sense of taste or smell.

Symptoms usually appear 2-14 days after exposure. How bad symptoms are and how long they last can be different for each person. Some people can test positive for the virus without ever having any symptoms. If you notice any of the above symptoms in your child, please consult with your physician.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds OR use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol</li> <li>• Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces</li> </ul>

- Children and staff with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 must be excluded from school and other public activities until:
  - 5 days after symptoms first appeared AND
  - No fever for at least 24 hours without using any fever-reducing medication AND
  - Other symptoms have improved.
- Children and staff who test positive for COVID-19 but do not have any symptoms must stay home until at least 5 days after the day they were tested
- Household members and other close contacts of children or staff with COVID-19 must stay home until the end of their quarantine (5 days after their last exposure to the person with COVID-19) in case they become sick.
- If your child begins experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, please consult with your health care provider.
- If you or your child become ill and it is a medical emergency, call 9-1-1 and seek medical care immediately.
