In the Midway







Student Council underwent several changes. Freshman members were included and the number of activities held for student entertainment such as pep rallies or paid performances was reduced from one each Friday to only one per month.


Freshman Virgil Thompson said, "Student Council is great. I think that it brings the school together and lifts everyone's spirits."





In the Theater




this year was great!"







The team was made up of








To graduate every student must recieve credits in electives and required classes. Many elective classes pro-vided students with the opportunity to learn hands on skills that they would not ordinarily learn.

The theme of the 1995 Plateau, volume 32, is "The Plateau In the Works." The 900 books ordered were printed by Jostens Printing & Publishing Co. in Clarksville, Tennessee. Each book contained 216 pages. The custom designed cover and backbone were craftline embossed, using the base color of black with silkscreen colors of Blue 349 and Yellow Gold 371. A Mission grain with color Gray 513 was also applied. The cover typestyle was in various sizes of 48 Benguiat Bold. The front and back endsheet were custom designed with hand drawn artwork in Sterling Silver 420 and Black 395 and senior names were in the design of the number 95.

The type was Style 31 Optima, 33 Platino, 34i Platino Bold, and 47i Benguiat Book. Optional typestyles included Style 17 Garamond, and 45 Times Roman. Captions were set in 9pt., body copy in 11pt., main headlines in 42 pt., sub-headlines in 14 pt., folio tabs in 8 pt., and division page headlines in 42 pt. 




