Proposed Attendance Zone Changes | 2027-2028

Why the Attendance Zones Are Changing

The proposed changes are designed to create more consistent feeder patterns for students in the Perry area.

1 Create consistent feeder patterns

Align elementary attendance zones more closely with the middle and high schools students will attend.

2 Follow boundaries families recognize

Lines follow major highways, power lines, or stream corridors, so a family can tell which side of the line they live on.

3 Keep more peers together

Allow more students to remain with the same group of peers as they transition from elementary to middle and high school.

4 Support enrollment planning

Better-aligned attendance zones help the district balance enrollment and plan for continued growth in the Perry area.

5 Support students during the transition

Grandfathering, existing out-of-zone provisions and advance notice to families help make the transition student and community friendly.

Grandfathering & Enrollment Planning

A key part of the plan is a student and community friendly transition for students and families.

Grandfathering

Students currently enrolled at an impacted school may request to remain at their current school rather than attend their newly zoned school.

*** Parents would be required to provide transportation.

Out-of-zone enrollment

- **House Bill 251** — any family may request another HCSD school with available space; the family provides transportation.
- **House Bill 224** — active-duty military families who live on the installation may request any HCSD school with available space.
- **ELL and Special Education services** — students placed at a specific school to receive services.
- **Senior Privilege** — students finishing grade 4, 7, or 11 may complete grade 5, 8, or 12 at the same school after a move within the county.

Enrollment planning note: Projected enrollment includes the proposed zoned population and current out-of-zone students for planning purposes. Actual enrollment may vary based on grandfathering decisions and other enrollment provisions.

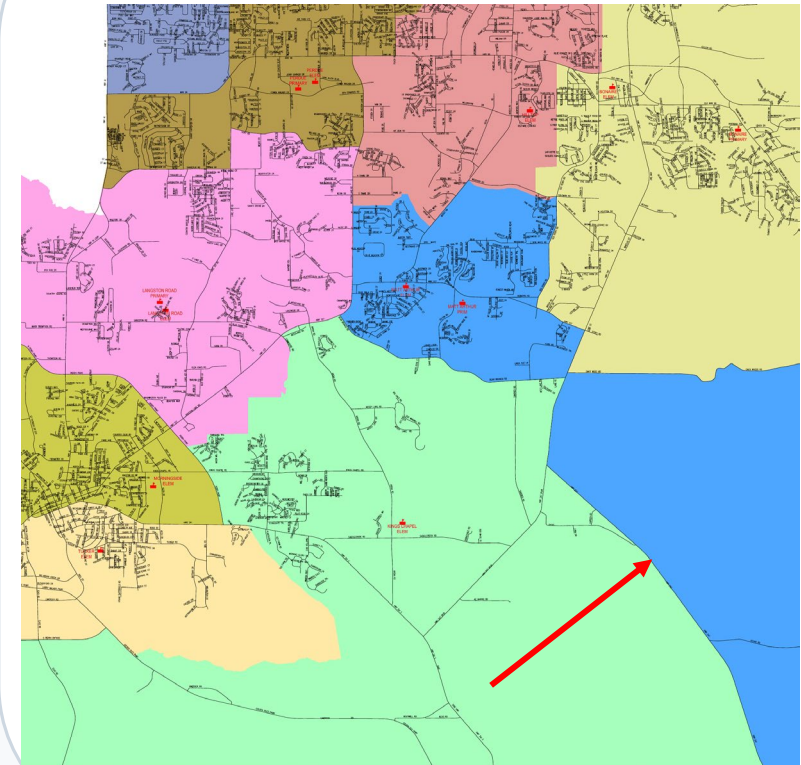

What changes

- Approximately 14 students move from Kings Chapel Elementary to the Matt Arthur schools:
 - 7 PK–2 students to Matt Arthur Primary.
 - 7 students in grades 3–5 to Matt Arthur Elementary.
- This aligns the affected area with Veterans Middle and Veterans High.

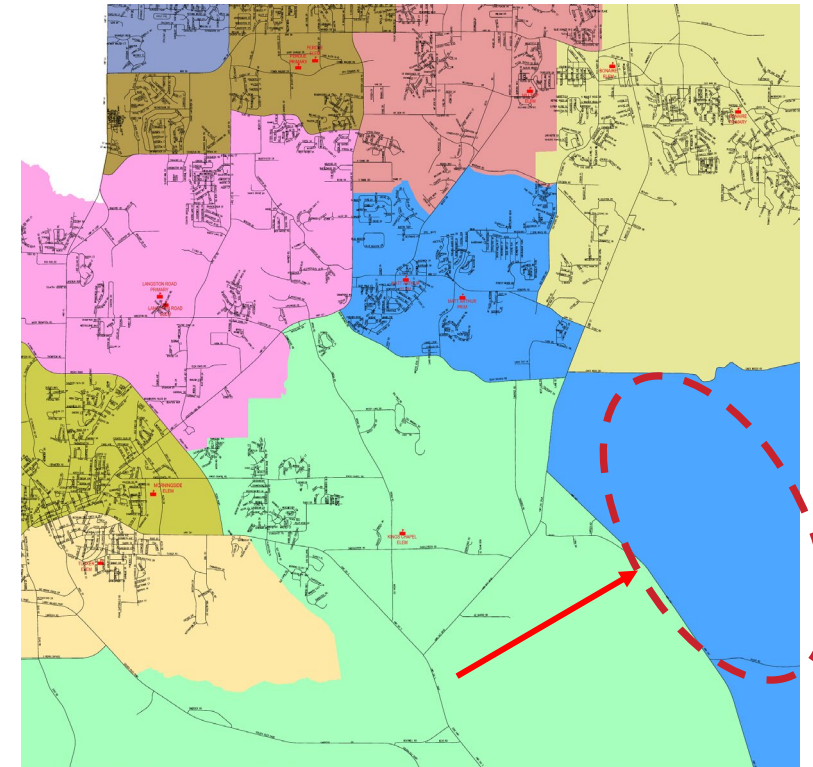

What changes

- The Matt Arthur sister schools share the same attendance zone.
- The affected area east of Highway 247 moves from Kings Chapel into the Matt Arthur attendance zone.
 - 7 PK–2 students move to Matt Arthur Primary.
 - 7 students in grades 3–5 move to Matt Arthur Elementary.
- The change creates a consistent MAPS → MAES → Veterans Middle → Veterans High feeder pattern.

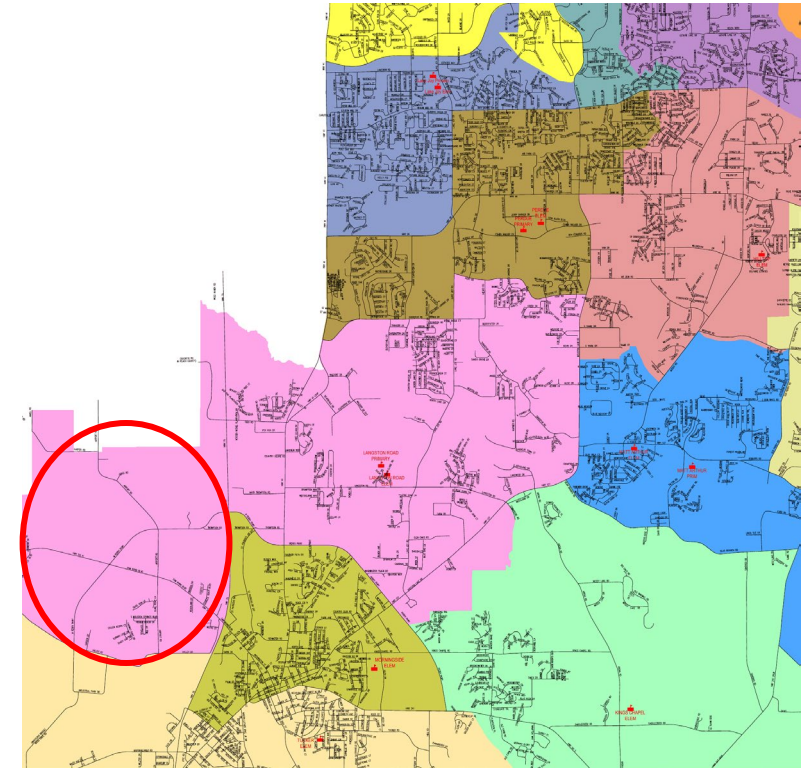

**Area to Langston Road schools**

What changes

- Approximately 23 students move from Tucker to the Langston Road schools:
 - 11 PK–2 students move to Langston Road Primary.
 - 12 students in grades 3–5 move to Langston Road Elementary.
- This change improves feeder-pattern alignment.

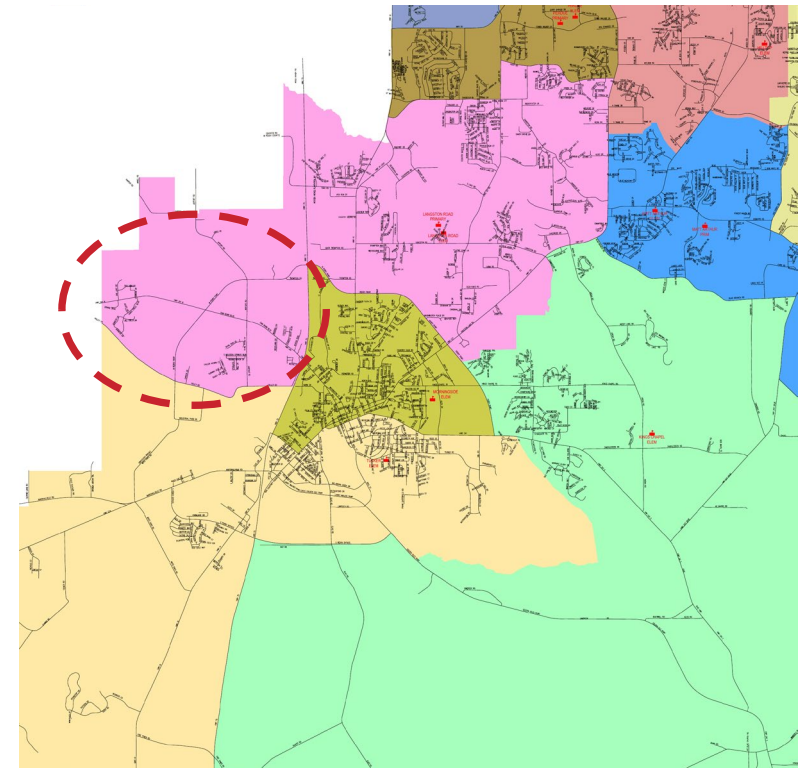
