ALMA MATER

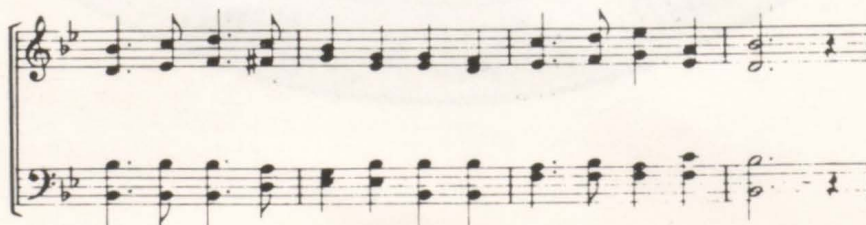

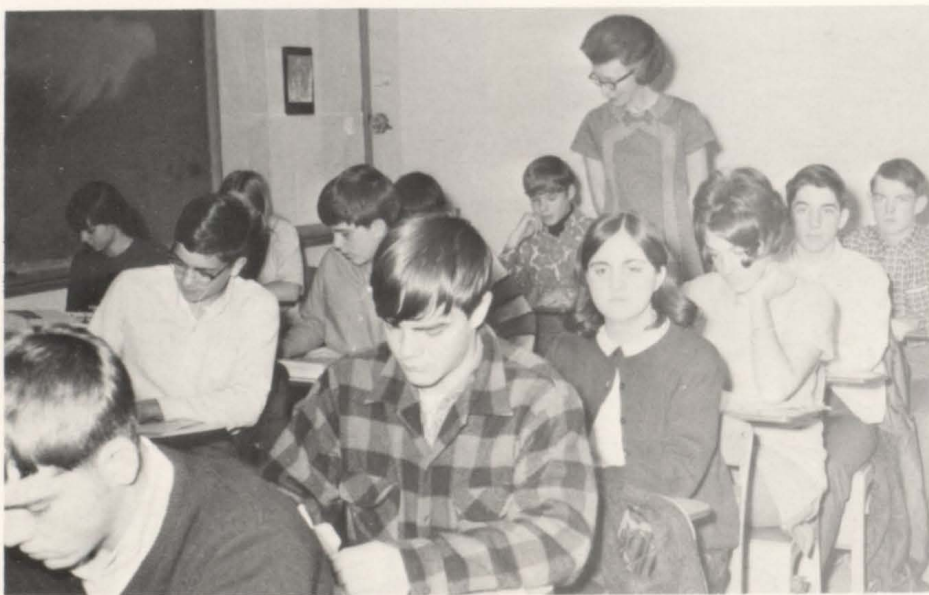

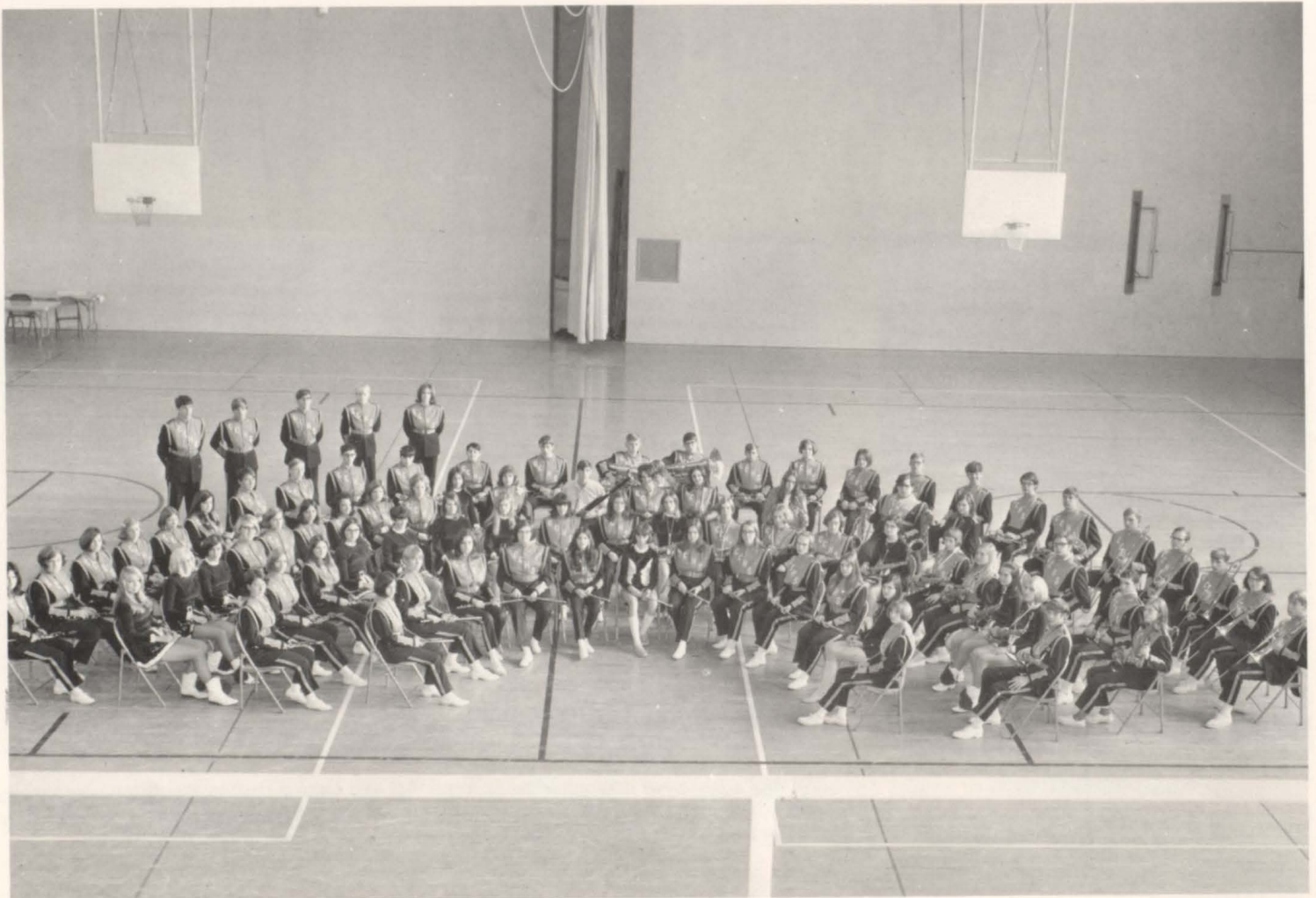

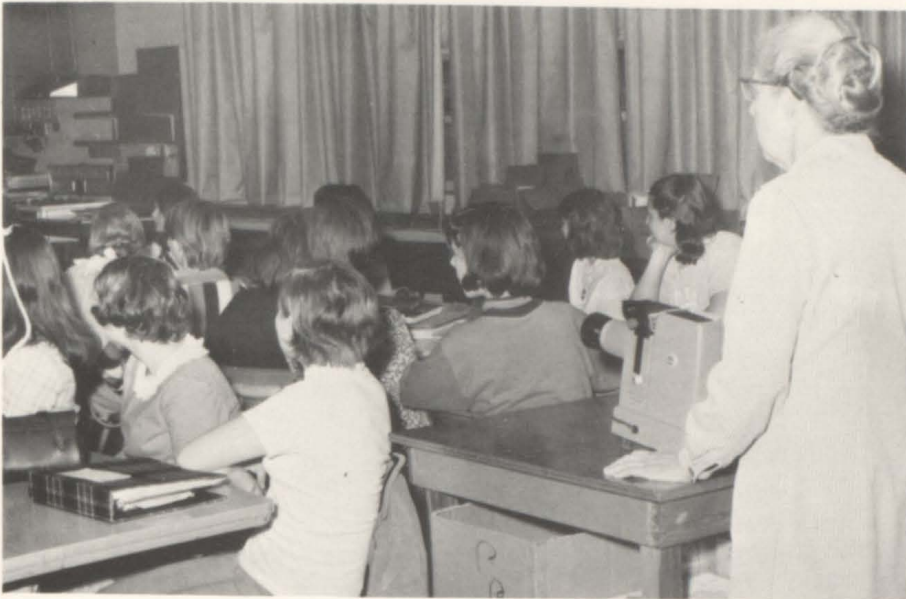

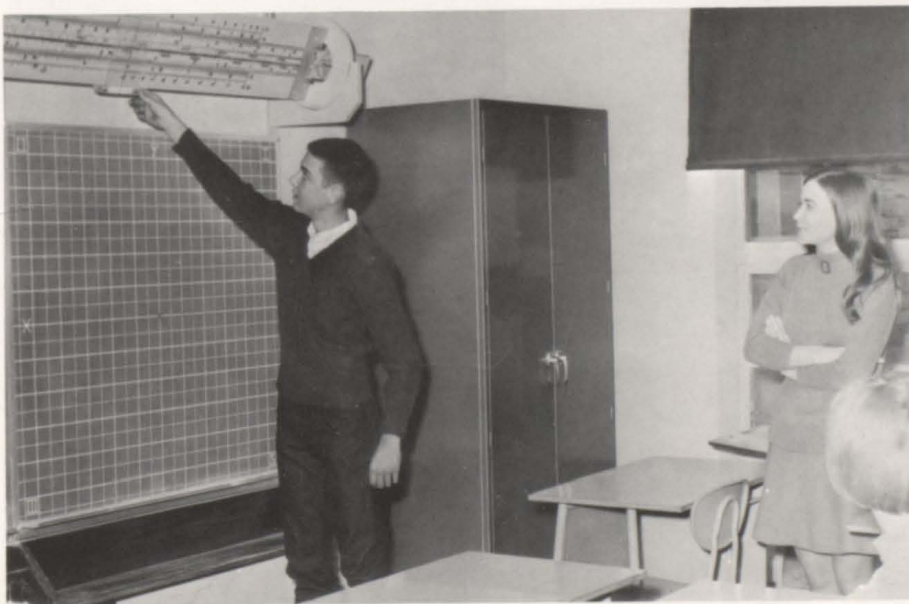

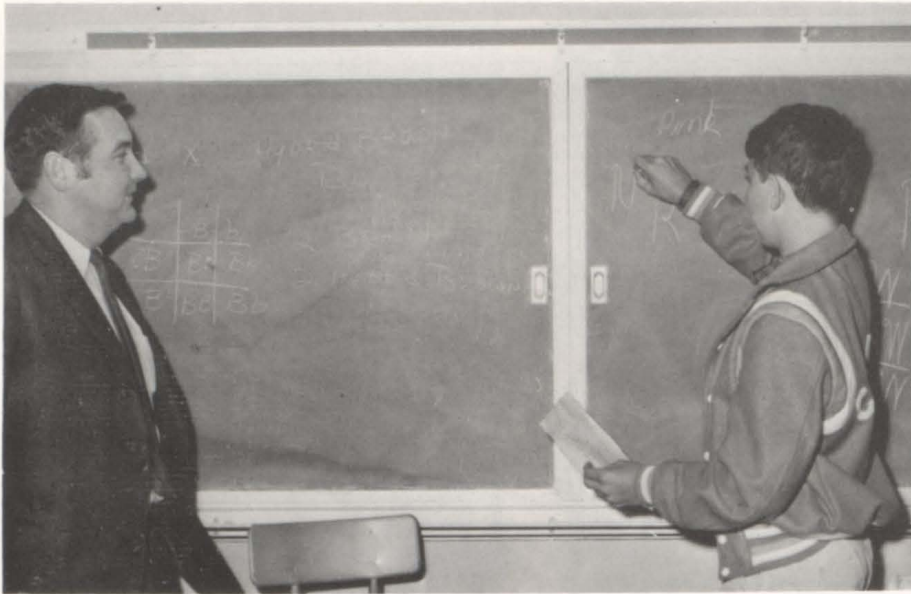

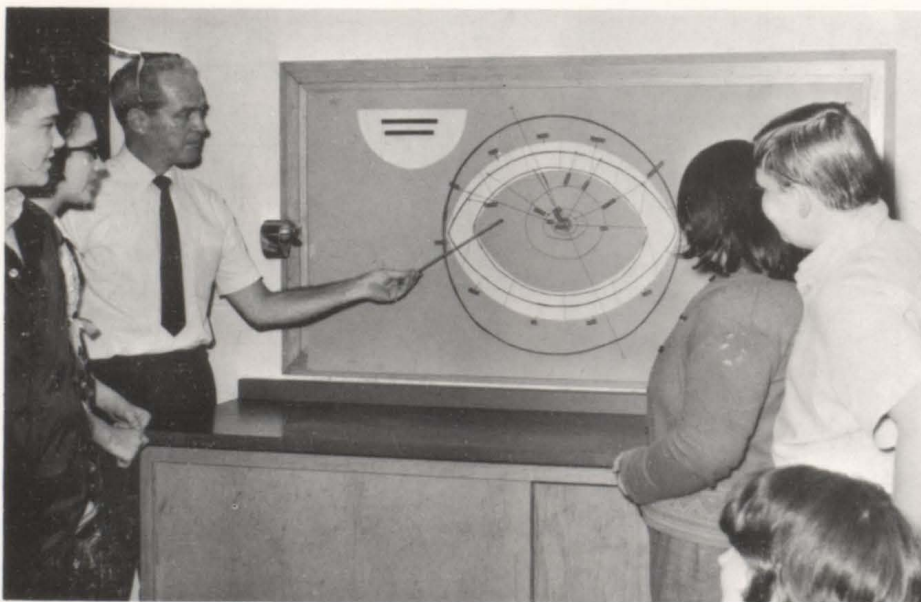

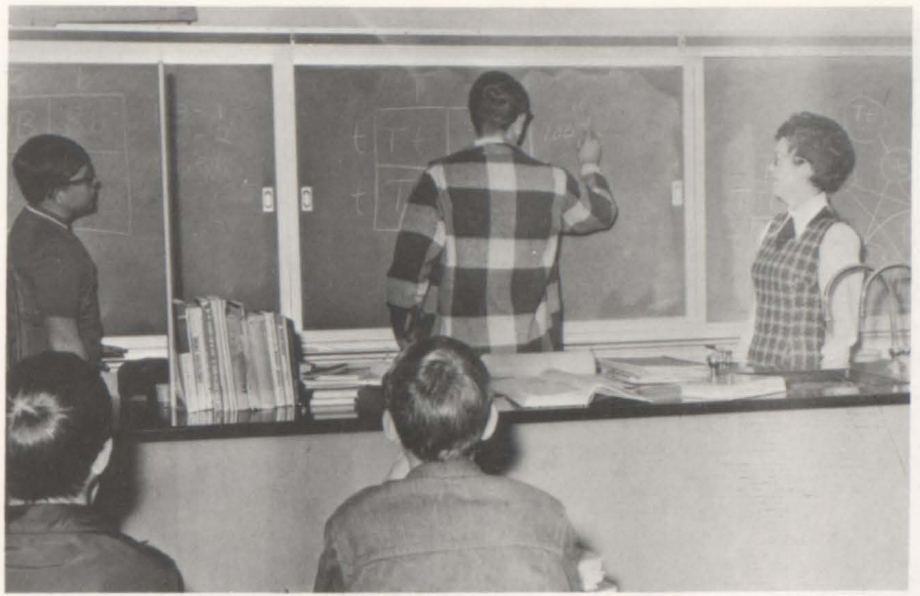

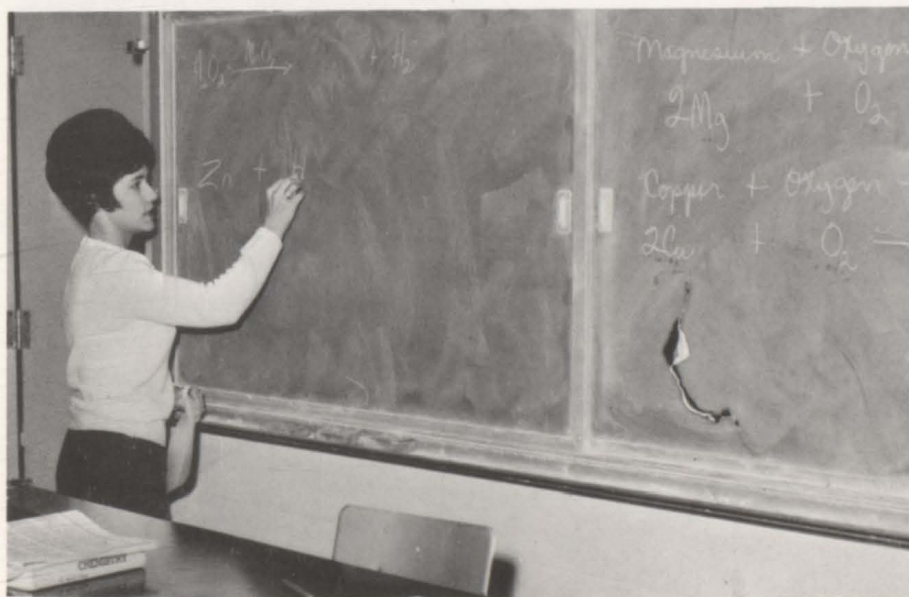

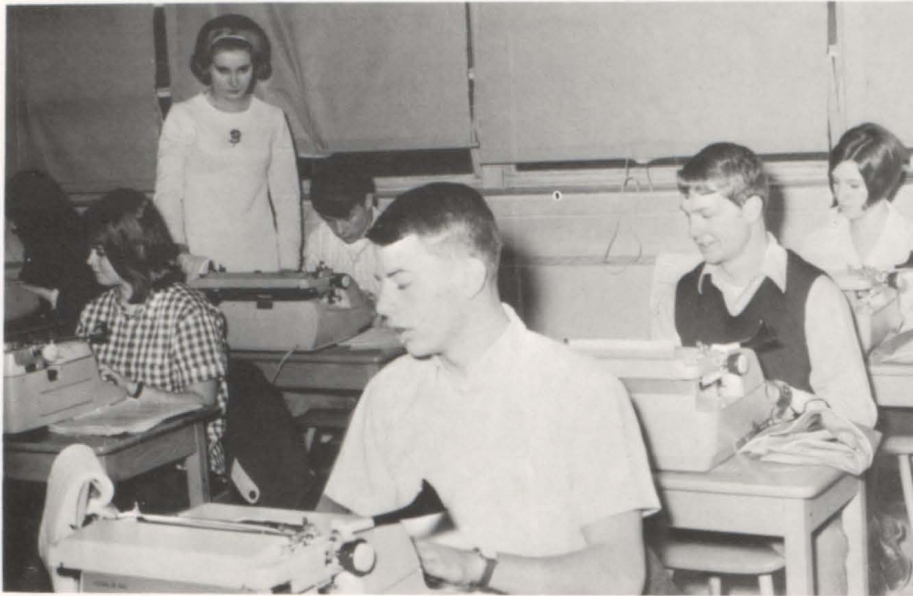

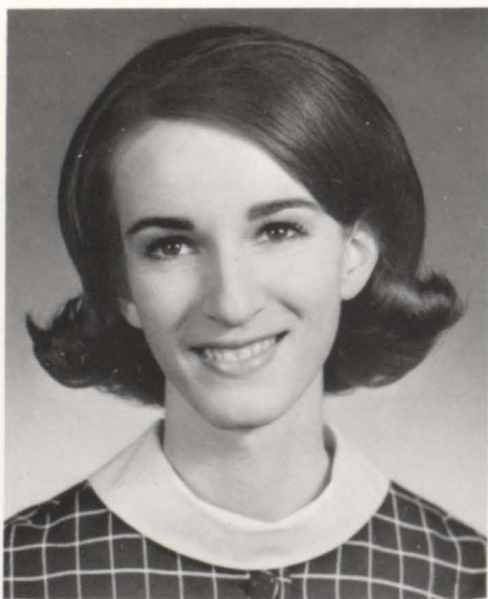

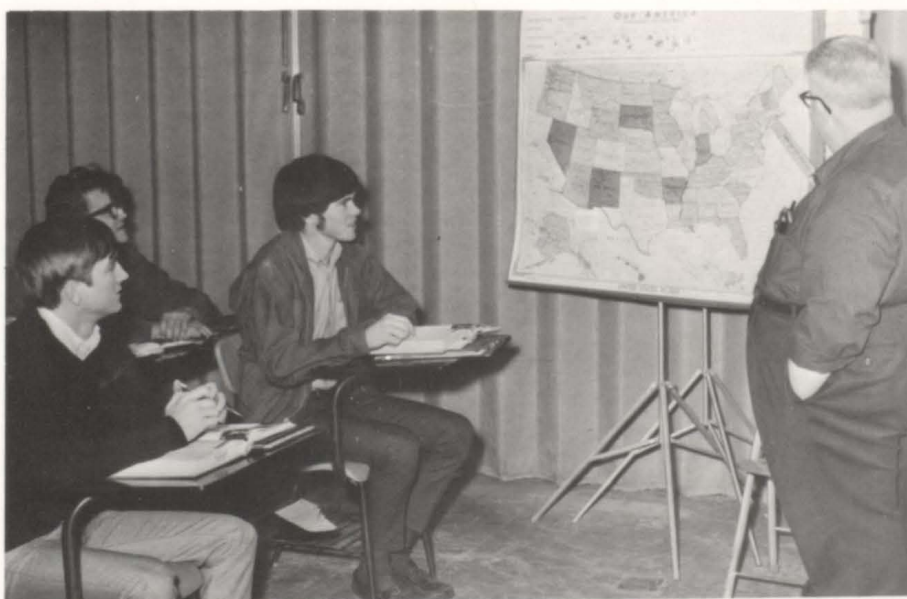

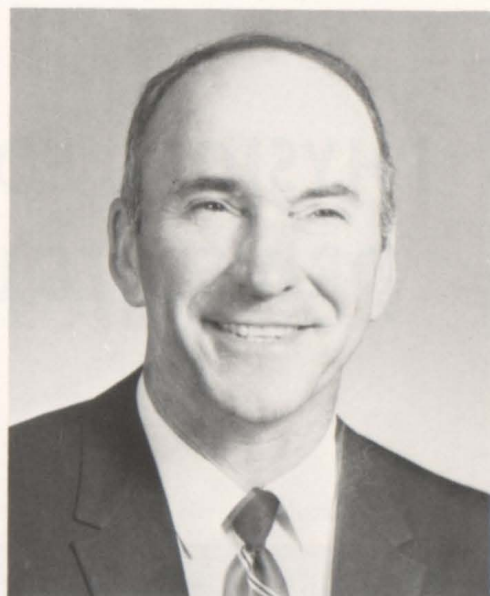

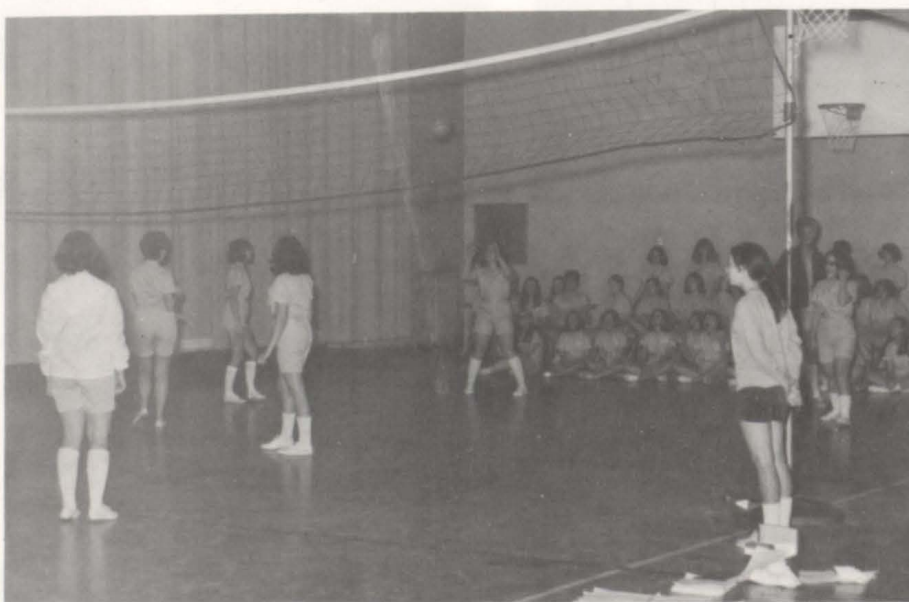

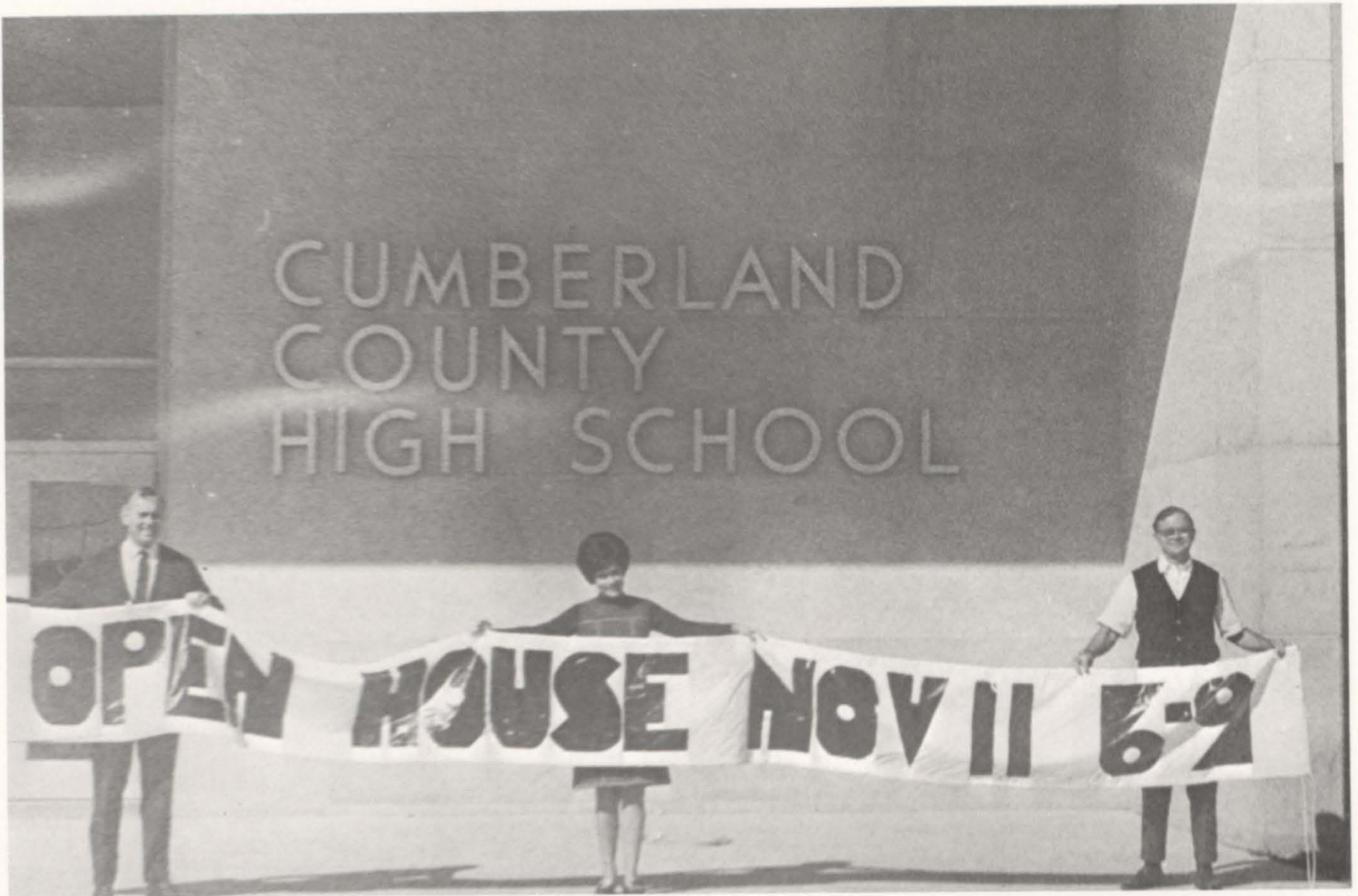

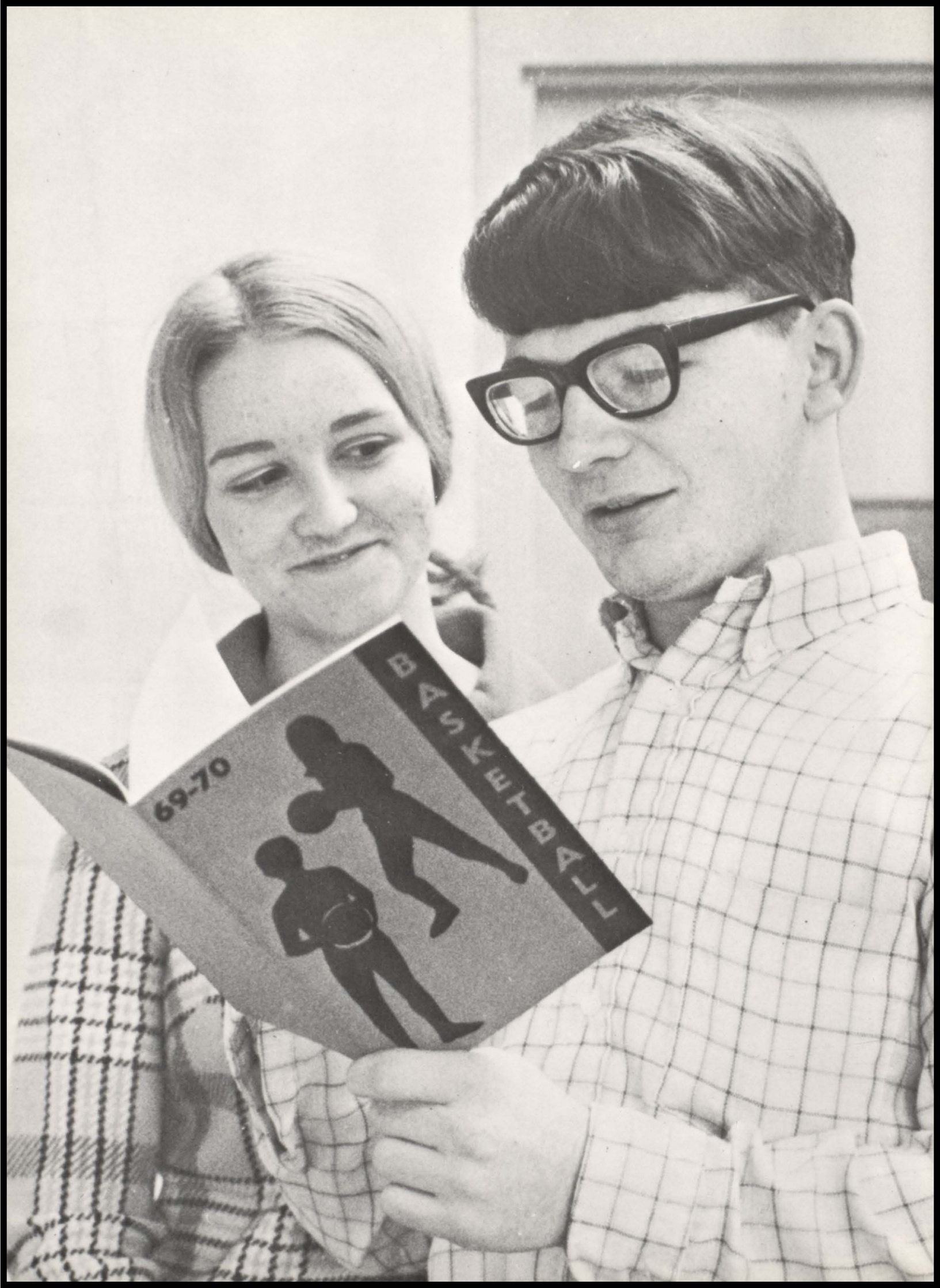

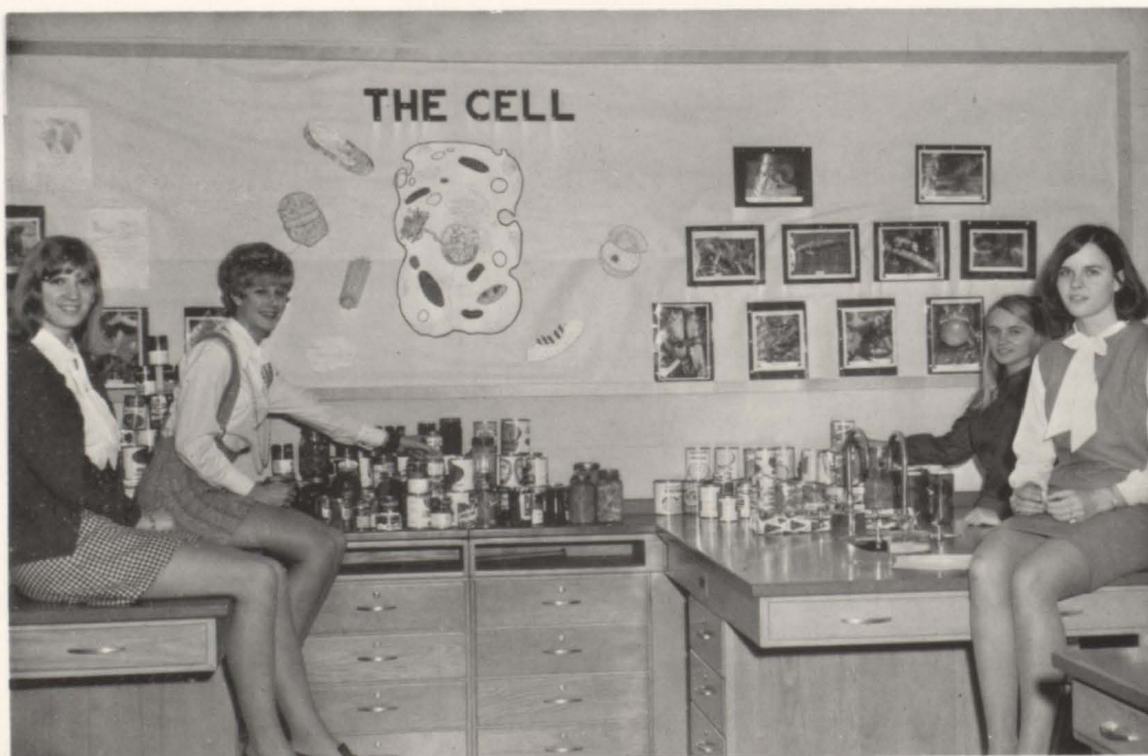

Christmas season was project time for the Student Council as they sponsored a contest to see which class could collect the most canned food. Afterwards, the food was distributed to needy families in the county.





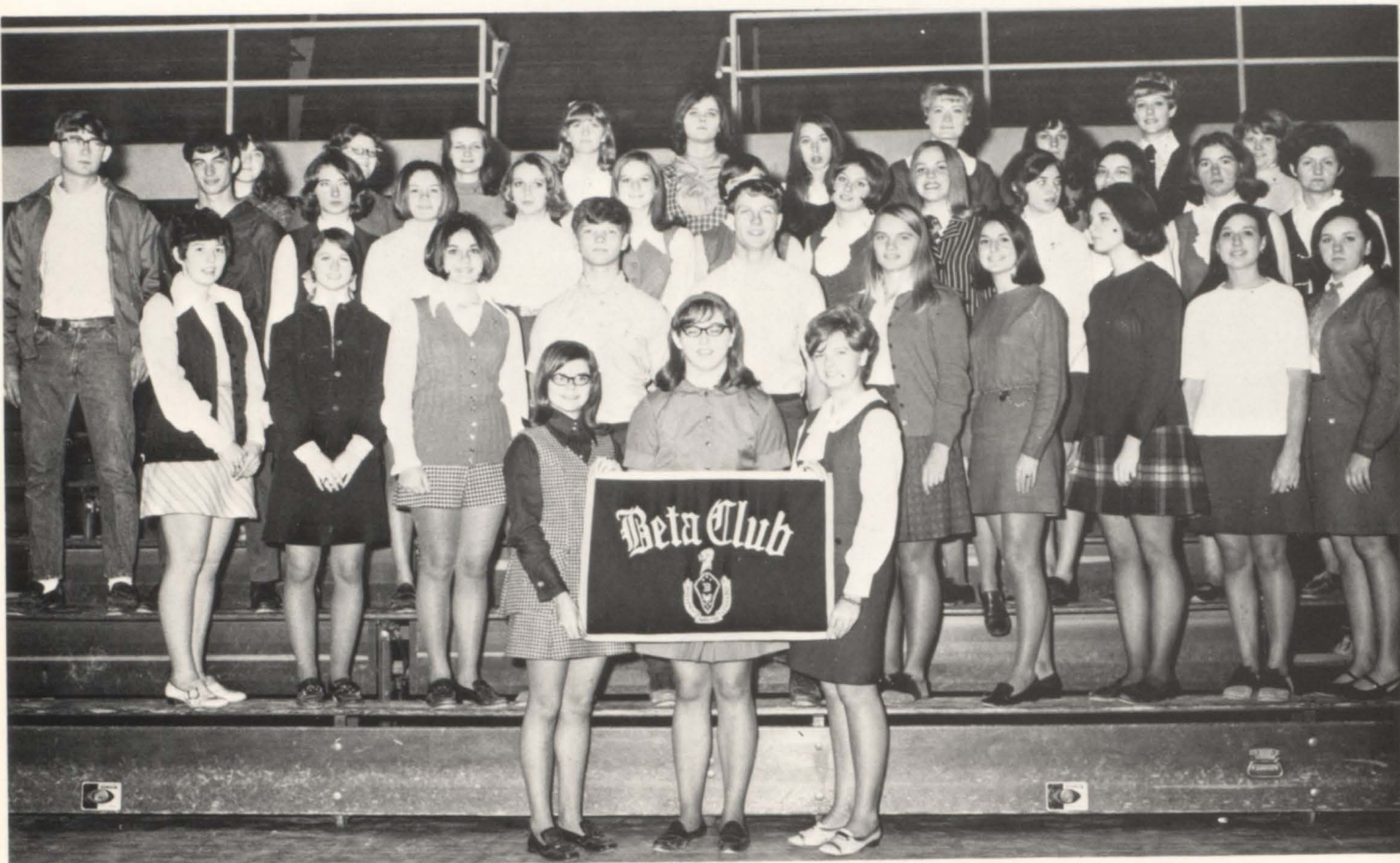

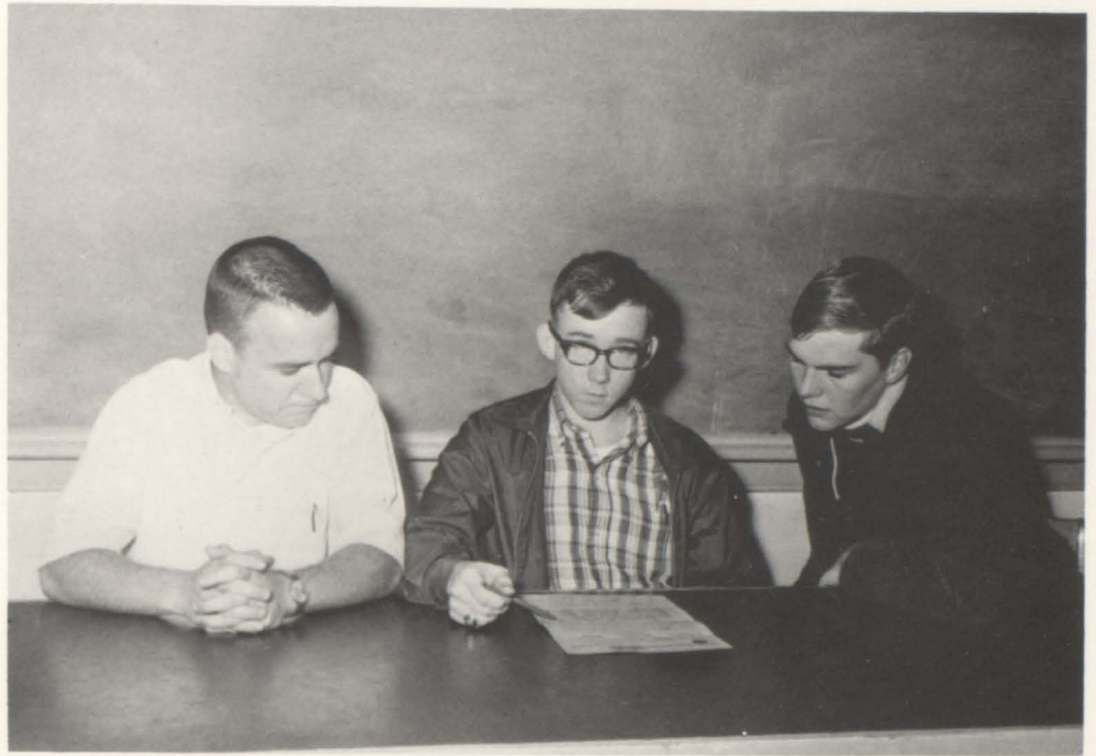

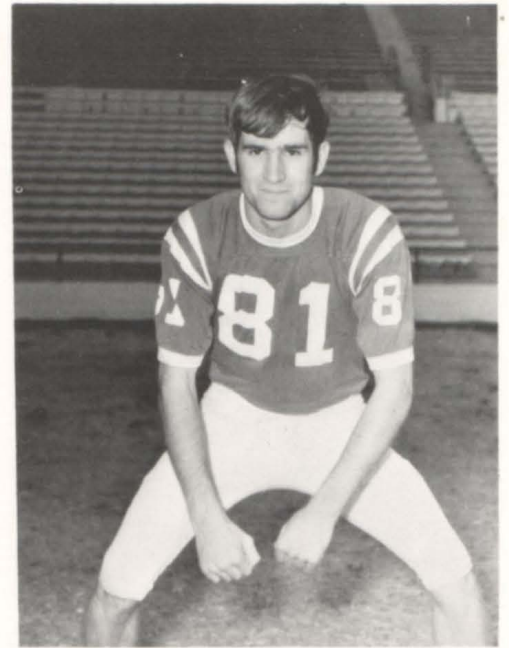

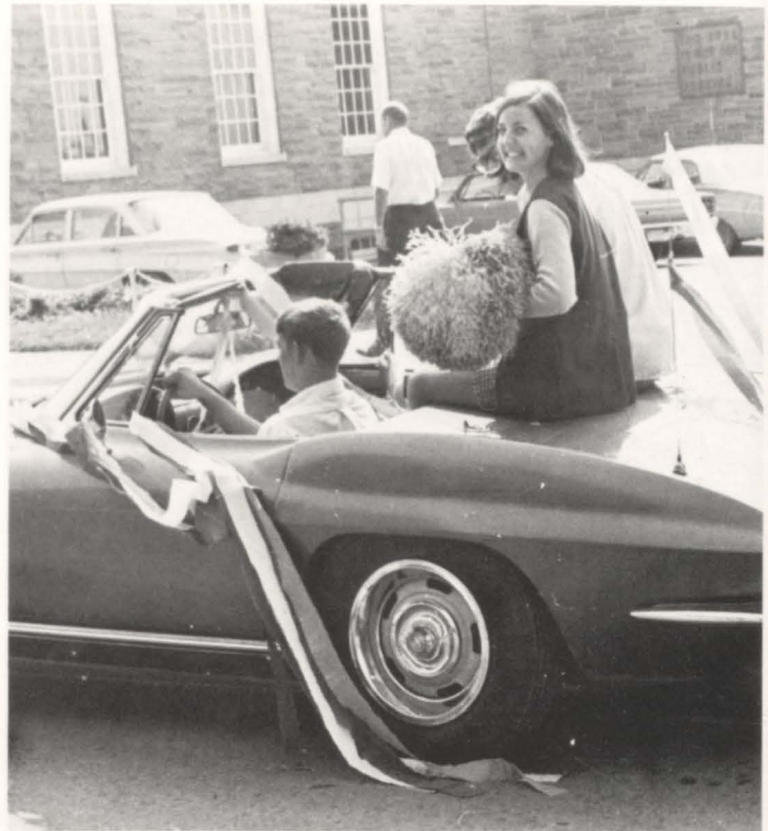
