#### **CURRICULUM ADOPTION**

District: Christian County

Crofton Elementary will implement the Christian County District Curriculum Map/Pacing Documents. We accept this curriculum based on our confidence that it:

- 1. Is based directly on Kentucky's Goals, Expectations, Core Content for Assessment and Program of Studies and reflects the connections among Kentucky's standards-based documents.

#### **TEACHER IMPLEMENTATION**

- 3. Our Comprehensive Planning process identifies a need for adjustments.
