Academic Achievement Goals: District Goal:

- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) will increase by three percentage points.
- To increase the percent of ELL, ED, and SWD scoring proficient and distinguished by six percent.

SHES Focus/Goals:

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

We will do this by *Providing ELA and Reading support in the are of ELA by implementing the Science of Reading. This includes a focus area of Phonics in K-2, Early Literacy in 1-3 and Literacy 4-5 with a focus of comprehension skills and understanding. Along with tutors to work with at risk students we also are also introducing daily ELT, where students will work within their academic reading level for 40 minutes daily.

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

The focus area for Math will be on Math Reasoning skills. These skills corelate with the work on the daily literacy skills. SHE will also provide tutored instruction 2 to 4 times a week if needed with the use of hired tutors that work 3 -4 hours daily and tutors that are available after school.

We are improving literacy and Math for ESOL students by providing a full time ESOL teacher that will work with and support the students daily across all subject areas. The goal is to increase the percent of ELL, ED, and SWD scoring proficient and distinguished by six percent.

Integrate STEAM activities through the daily lab that students rotate through to increase critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and problem solving.

SHES will focus on improving by:

*Providing research based literacy instructional strategies

*Implementing differentiated instruction in all content areas

- *Facilitating independent reading of the highest academic challenge based on Lexile levels
- *Vertically applying research based writing strategies across the curriculum
- *technology in every classroom, students devices are 1 to 1 in K through 5
