TRINITY SUNDAY

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend as we gather, we celebrate the reality of who God is in Himself – that God is the Persons in one substance. This is much more than it seems on the surface. See, we are individual persons. Consider a family of three, perhaps, of Dad, Mom, and Child. There are three persons. While they all are human, they do not share each other's substance or existence.

Yet, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, indeed three persons, all share in the one existence that is God. Our minds cannot comprehend this mystery, nor are we meant to understand. But our great hope is that one day we shall see the Holy Trinity and ponder the reality of God for the rest of eternity.

So, to recap, we ponder that reality of Who God is in Himself this weekend as three co-equal persons eternally existence in one substance. As we ponder, the temptations might be to reduce God to what He does for us, especially creation, redemption, and sanctification – but when One Person of the Trinity is at work, all are in His own way.

This week, we are honored to have the Totus Tuus missionaries with us. They will be with our elementary students during the day and high school students in the evening. The focus is on the Eucharist. I look forward to the programs.

As announced last weekend and on FaceBook, I have scheduled a pilgrimage to the Holy Land for September 16-26, 2024. I had attempted to arrange a pilgrimage several times, and was forced to cancel, but it seems appropriate to move ahead at this time. Part of the reason for the announcement so early is to give time to save for this opportunity – it is expensive and will be about \$4,650 per person, based on double occupancy rooms. Aside from midday meals, it is fairly all inclusive from our departure from MSP until our return.

The difference between a pilgrimage and a tour is that a tour is to see the sights, to enjoy the food and culture, and to shop, perhaps. While some of that will occur on a pilgrimage, the primary purpose is to immerse ourselves in prayer and encountering our Lord. Especially with the Holy Land, we will walk where He walked, we will be in places where He and the saints, especially the Blessed Mother lived, ate, encountered the Lord. These places will give insight into our prayer and study of Scripture – indeed to be a pilgrim in the Holy Land is to study what some have called “The Fifth Gospel”.

On this pilgrimage, we will visit most of the sites of the New Testament – Nazareth, Bethlehem, Cana, Capernaum, Jerusalem, the place of the Sermon on the Mount, the multiplication of the loaves, the Transfiguration, and so much more. I invite you to pray-fully consider joining me on this pilgrimage. If you have questions, please contact me.

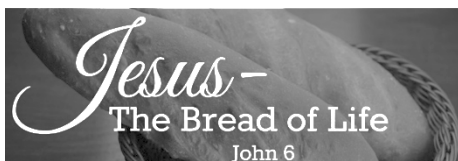

LITURGY MATTERS #30

After the priest has genuflected in adoration before the blood of Christ present in the consecrated cup, he sings or says solemnly the words, "The Mystery of Faith!" This is not so much a rubrical instruction like, "Stand up now" or "Start singing." It is an exclamation of awe and wonder and is the supreme moment in the liturgy for using this word mystery.

Something is hidden in the bread and wine. Faith perceives it. As if in answer to the priest's exclamation, the voice of the assembly rings out declaring what is perceived: "Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free."

There are other possible responses with which the assembly may answer the priest's exclamation. In all of them we are announcing what is hidden in the bread and wine. We should be aware that each of the possible formulas is a condensed expression of the center of our salvation and mentions the past event of Jesus' death, the present reality of his resurrection, and his future coming in glory. All of that—past, present, and future—is hidden in what lies on the altar, and faith perceives it and proclaims it.

What the people express in the condensed formula of the Mystery of Faith anticipates what the priest says and does next. The last words of Jesus, which he pronounced over the cup of wine were, "Do this in memory of me." The Greek word in this text is anamnesis, and, similar to the word epiclesis, it has long been used as a technical liturgical term designating a particular part of the Eucharistic prayer. The anamnesis is this part that we are beginning now, and the word literally means "a memorial."

Insofar as the whole Eucharistic prayer has a narrative strand that runs through it, it is all memorial or anamnesis. In a stricter sense, the anamnesis is this prayer that follows the proclamation of the Mystery of Faith.

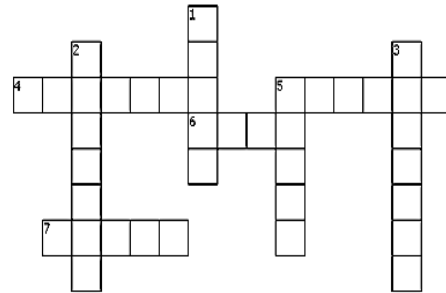
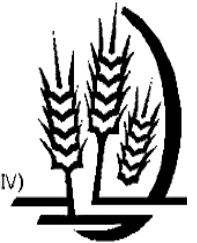
