Library Skills

The purpose of the library is to provide access to books that will increase reading, viewing, and using information that will create lifelong learners. Solving problems, making decisions, and becoming independent readers are all experiences that are offered in the library.

Library skills are taught throughout the year, and include the simple habits of taking care of print materials, to locating information and knowing where to find books in the Everybody/Picture Books, Chapter Books, Fiction and Non-fiction (Dewey Decimal System) sections of the library.

Some additional skills taught include:

- Check-in/out, and return procedures, shelf markers.
- Book parts: cover, illustrations, spine, title page, title, author, etc.
- Comprehension and recall details of stories recognizing the beginning, middle, and end.
- Understanding the various types of literature which include: fairy tales, biographies, poetry, fables, etc.
- Student use of the electronic catalog.
