1. Introductions

a. Mrs. Diederich, Mr.s Phelps and all who were in attendance introduced themselves .

2. LCAP Summary and Input

- These are the goals used in the district in which we can support all students.
- All in attendance discussed what site their children attended and told Mrs. Dietrich if they were still in the EL program or had been exited.
- c. There was discussion asking parents if they knew how to read the ELPAC scores that are sent home. It was shared by one parent that they had questions about their son's scores. In turn they reached out to the school site para and she explained the scores to them. They were very appreciative.
- d. A suggestion of having a visual to help explain the scores would be helpful.
- e. Mrs. Diedrich thought maybe we could create a breakdown that would go along with the scores to help read the scores.
- f. Mrs. Dietrich told the group this year we are hoping to have ELPAC scores back in May.
- g. Mrs. Diederich- Anything else in here that we need to adjust or add to make it more helpful for our students?
 - i. My kids struggle with the sound of words so support in this area would be helpful.
 - ii. Mrs. Diederich- this year everyone had Parent Teacher Conference

- iii. It was much more helpful & easier to read than the test results. It was a great help.
- iv. Conferences which had the "Progress Monitoring Form" did this make sense or was it explained to you?
- v. Mrs. Diederich- it seems we really need more information on what the program is and how to read the test results.
- vi. Having bilingual paras is really helpful for our students so we are grateful for them.

- a. Summer School- it is more intensive this year. What about Art this year?
 - i. Mrs. Phelps- we were not able to obtain art teachers for this summer school. We will be having a band & orchestra but this program will be for current students. If your child is a candidate for summer school, they will receive an invite at the end of February when they receive their report cards.
 - ii. Mrs. Phelps- we really need bilingual paraprofessionals this year. If any of you haven't applied, and can that would be great.
- b. As parents, how can the district help students who are being exposed to various scenarios (vaping)? What kind of outreach to parents can we have in order to help those families pay more attention to this?
 - i. Mrs. Diederich- principals are constantly attending training on how to recognize those students & how to intervene.
 - ii. Academically that is all important, but it is also important to help our kids socioemotional on how to cope without turning to substances.
 - iii. Mrs. Diederich- this is a huge problem. Many of our students do not believe that vaping is dangerous & it is easy to get so students are still thinking it is harmless despite that not being true.
 - iv. We need to educate ourselves on what these items look like so that we can know what to look for. Past officers brought items in to teach what these items look like- maybe we need to bring that information back.
 - v. Impactful stories from people who have become sick really makes it clear to students what the repercussions are. Maybe since vaping is so new, it would be hard to find experience.
 - vi. I suggest to parents to be involved in the school as much as you can. I am sure if my kids see me at school they are going to think twice before doing something.
