What can your Student do here at PV?

Students

- Work hard during class. Unfinished class work turns into homework
- Complete homework on time
- Try to be organized with their school materials
- Study for tests and quizzes
- Add a math support class (Geometry and Algebra 2)
- Come to school every day!

Students and teachers

- For extra support make arrangements before school, at lunch or after school
- Make sure you know your teachers grading and late work policy
- Ask for help during class time
- Email after school hours for help
- Make arrangements for missed days or late work as soon as possible

Effective School Solutions- Therapeutic Services

- A family strengthening, leadership development program that maintains that at the base of every culture, community, family and parent are resiliency factors that can be tapped to assist parents and family members to build positive, healthy relationships with their children and themselves.
- By referral
- Paired with student course, Joven Noble Con Palabra
- Community Liaison
- Refers students and families to various community resources, provide school supplies, & other items students may need in order to remove barriers for them to attend school & be successful.
- Fighting Back SM Valley
- FBSMV is a non-profit organization that strives to help at-risk youth. They offer parenting classes but mostly work with substance abuse and vaping. They offer conflict mediation at each school to help students feel safe. They also have liaisons that work with students in foster care and/or are homeless.

What can parents do at home?

- Ask your student about school? Academics and personal/ social
- Ask them to show you their Aeries portal for missing assignments
- Email teachers and counselors
- Call counselors to review Aeries and set up a parent conference
- Be aware of your student's credit progress towards graduation and completing the A-G requirements, if they are college bound

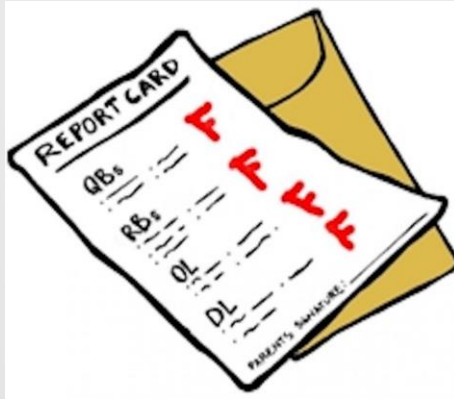

Credit Recovery

Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO)/Intervention Through Technology(ITT)

- Failed courses and lost credits are recovered
- PLATO is an online program
- These classes are taken during the school day
- Can be worked on after school hours and weekends to make more progress. Test must be done in class
- Students can recover high school requirements
- A-G courses with D's or F's



Summer School

- The first 3 weeks after school Ends
- 15 days
- PLATO program is the majority
- Attendance is very important, and students can be dropped for not attending the first couple of days
- Must attend assigned session. Can continue PLATO at home, nights, weekends etc. to make progress faster
- Live classes may be available but very limited and structured
