I didn't expect the nurse on the other end of the telephone line to tell me that I had cancer and needed to see an oncologist right away. I didn't expect to have major surgery 14 days later. And I certainly didn't expect for my oncologist to call and tell me that, instead of one tumor, I had two. "So what's next?" I asked. Chemotherapy and radiation was his response. I must admit that those words terrified me.

And so my journey began. Although it is a difficult journey, it has been made increasingly bearable because of the outpouring of love, prayers, encouragement, and strength from an amazing student body and staff and faculty here at CCHS. Students I have never even taught began stopping by my room just to check on me. My door was covered with well wishes, notes to "Stay strong," and assurances of prayers going up on my behalf. The cheerleaders wore peach ribbons on their shoelaces for "Pink-Out Night" and decided to keep them on the rest of the season to support my battle. The faculty and staff added stars of encouragement to a lovely tinsel tree that made my room festive for Christmas and welcomed me back after my surgery.

Now that I have lost my hair, my students have been incredibly supportive. They love my crazy hats and don't even mind when I get hot and have to take my hat off for a few minutes. My principal and his wonderful assistants have assured me that getting well should be my priority. They didn't just say those words; they prove them to me on a daily basis.

Yes, cancer is a difficult journey that I hope none of you ever have to face. But I can honestly say that if you do have to walk the pathway some day, I pray that you have support from a family just like mine at CCHSI

A Surprise Battle:

I was 53 when I was told that I had breast cancer. I remember going for a routine checkup and knowing something was not right by the concern that was shown by my caregivers. I have always been healthy, no broken bones, no stitches, first and only time in the hospital was when I was having my daughter. There had been no history of breast cancer in my family.

Three years later I am healthy and free of cancer. I attribute this to many things. I had wonderful doctors that took the absolute best care of me. I have a brand new appreciation for the medical field. I am very thankful for my wonderful Doctors and all of the people that got me through the different treatments. I had wonderful friends that were always there to prop me up when things got tough. Chemotherapy is a wonderful, powerful drug and it saved my life but there are some side-effects that are powerful too. When things got rough, I had many that surrounded me and supported me to keep going. I also had my CCHS family that was always there.

I missed many things while going through treatment. Many



of these were things that were required because of my job. So many people here took control and never thought about the time that it was taking from their daily lives to cover my duties. I have a wonderful family. My husband and my daughter were there by my side as I went through treatment, always holding my hand and encouraging me to be strong. Finally, my church was a great support to me as I battled this disease. Food, cards, phone calls, encouragement from others that had gone through this also helped. I believe that the Lord never puts more on you than you can handle so deep inside I knew I could get through this.

Out of this journey, the number one thing that I have realized is that you should never take your health for granted. It is precious and not to be taken lightly. These days I try to eat right, get exercise, and hopefully be a good example to anyone that will have to take the journey.
















# Shooting, it is for the birds
