We had all our teachers, staff, and assistants return in August, except for our Middle School ELA teacher who will join us at the end of October following her maternity leave.

iPads, eBooks, and more...

This year, students in grades 2 – 8 received the latest Apple Generation 9 iPad. Through the Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF), we received a grant that enabled us to purchase new iPads for the students. In addition to this technology, students also have access to electronic textbooks, known as eBooks, for most of their subjects. No longer can students say, “I forgot my book at school”. If families have Wi-Fi, students can access classroom information and resources; they can read eBooks on their iPads, as well as get help with math, reading, and grammar by using their online tutorial programs, IXL, Accelerated Reader, and MyOn.

Students have a vast library at their fingertips. They can choose from over 600 online books on their iPad from their MyOn app. Students then take reading comprehension quizzes on Accelerated Reader to reach their personal reading goals. As we know, technology doesn’t always provide the best learning opportunities, so students also receive traditional textbooks and workbooks for each subject.

Middle School Academics

The 6th grade students have been learning about the scientific method in Ms. Gouge's science classroom. Last week they grew bacteria in a Petri dish. This week they conducted a scientific investigation and observed their bacteria specimens under a microscope.



In Social Studies, student presentations showed their understanding of the Neolithic Age by creating villages that depicted the change from hunter-gathers to the dependence on plants, animals, and crafts.
