All Parents, Staff, Faculty, and Employees

In October 1986, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), Public Law 99-519 was enacted. The rule requires all schools, both public and private, to inspect for friable and non-friable asbestos building materials, to develop asbestos management plans that address asbestos hazards in school buildings, and to implement response actions in a timely fashion. Additionally, the Environmental Protection Agency's Asbestos Containing Materials in Schools, Final Rule and Notice, 40 CFR Part 763 (Oct. 1986) requires that all public and government school buildings be inspected and re-inspected for the presence of asbestos every three years after a management plan is in effect. This same statute also requires initial and annual notification of the availability of a management plan that outlines the steps to be taken to eliminate the hazard. We comply with this statute, ensuring timely notification to the parents & guardians of our students as well as our own staff and faculty.

This correspondence represents the annual notification that is required by the Asbestos-Containing Material in Schools Rule, published at 40 CFR Part 763, Subpart E. Sherman Indian High School is providing this notice to inform the parents, teachers, and employee's organization about location where they may review the asbestos management plan prepared for Sherman Indian High School. Notifications of this kind are provided twice during the yearly cycle. In the event that we initiate construction or need to alter our structures in any manner that would involve contained asbestos, additional notification would be provided.

As a result of our recent building survey concerning asbestos, we must advise that Sherman Indian High School contains a small portion of asbestos. Please note that the contained or segregated asbestos is common in structures built before 1975.

A periodic surveillance (every six months) inspection will be conducted in accordance with EPA 40 CFR 763.92 (b) to be sure that the material is not disturbed.

Also, a re-inspection (every third year) will be conducted in accordance with EPA 40 CFR 763.85 (b).

We have received a management plan which is available for public review in the administrator's office during normal business hours.
