- State Fair Community College's dual credit opportunities allow eligible high school students to simultaneously earn high school and college credit by taking classes at their high school and online.
- SFCC's offering spans across a 14-county service area reaching more than 40 high schools.
- > Affordable
  - > \$76 per credit hour for on campus courses
  - > \$91 per credit hour for online
- Dual credit students also have access to the same resources as college students, including the Proctor Library, tutoring lab and mySTAR access.

- Recommended by a school official
- Appropriate placement scores for math, reading and writing, such as ACT, COMPASS or ACCUPLACER in the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile.
- Application, HS Transcripts and all completed enrollment forms.

#### **Sophomore Level Student**

- Grade point average of 3.0
- Recommended by a school official
- Appropriate placement scores for math, reading and writing, such as ACT, COMPASS or ACCUPLACER
- Application, HS Transcripts and all completed enrollment forms.

#### **Junior or Senior Level Student**

- Grade point average of 2.5
- Recommended by a school official
- Appropriate placement scores for math, reading and writing, such as ACT, COMPASS or ACCUPLACER.
- Application, HS Transcripts and all completed enrollment forms

# STEP 1: HOW DO STUDENTS QUALIFY?

#### STEP 2: Complete the Dual Credit Application on our website.

- Application is being updated
- Be sure to complete all required fields
- Use a personnel email address (Watch those firewalls)

#### STEP 3: Take the ACT or ACCUPLACER

- Remember, you can only take the ACCUPLACER once a week.
- Use Multiple Measures as placement for math and English

#### STEP 4: What courses do students need? What do we offer?

Consider what courses your students need and where they might be transferring too. It is important that courses are transferrable. SFCC offers core classes, such as English, math and history, which are transferrable to other Missouri College and Universities. 
