Hello,

This week, we explored the topic of handling problems and introduced a unique way of viewing them, whether they are big or small. To make this idea come to life, we engaged in a fun and interactive activity involving blowing bubbles. The bubbles symbolized our problems. Sometimes we have small problems and sometimes they are big. Sometimes one or two problems and sometimes we have many. Sometimes our problems simply go away on their own like when bubbles pop in the air, and sometimes we have to do something in order to make them go away, or pop. Sometimes, we may face just one or two issues, while at other times, it may feel like we're juggling many.


Regardless of how big or small or how many problems we have, the main message is that they will not last forever. At some point in our lives, they will go away. Through this activity, students could see how some problems, like bubbles, might float away and disappear on their own, while others may need a little effort to pop or resolve. The key takeaway is that no matter the size or number of challenges we encounter, they are temporary. Problems, like bubbles, won't last forever.

We believe this engaging exercise will leave a lasting impression on our students. It teaches them to approach challenges with patience and resilience, knowing that their troubles will eventually pass. Our hope is that when they face tough situations in the future, they will remember this activity, take a breath, and remind themselves that problems are not permanent. This understanding can help them stay calm and confident, easing their worries and allowing them to navigate life with a more positive outlook.

Greetings!

What fun it was to have the election this last week. We got to walk our way through the whole election process. The students were excited to see the results come in and find out who the new elected officials would be. We have been learning about elections and what different positions do in the government. Ask your student what the qualifications for being president of the United States are and you'll see they know all three of them!

In science we have been learning about how plants get water from the roots to the leaves. We've been learning about the nutrients going up stems and how different roots absorb water whether it's a diffused root or a tap root and what kind of roots are most common in our area because we live in such a dry climate.

Next week as spelling begins we actually have new worksheets and for some they will have an increased spelling list which I think will go well. I am seeing students getting much better at their reading and that brings great joy to me as I see them enjoying being able to read more. In language arts all three classes are learning about nouns, whether it's proper nouns in first grade, indefinite nouns in second grade and pronouns and verbs in third grade.

In math we are continuing on with first grade adding to 10. Second grade is adding to 20 and third grade is doing four digit addition with regrouping. All students are doing quite well. Different manipulatives add a dimension to their work and real time situations as well.

Next week is Veterans Day and conference week and I can't wait for us to get together and visit. The students will be included in the conference meeting. I have found that this is extremely helpful.




