

## Credits! what are they?

- Credit(s)- is one-half or one point awarded for completing and passing a class within MCPSS.
  - 24 credits are required to receive a regular high school diploma from any Mobile County Public High School.
  - 26 credits are required to receive an honors diploma from any Mobile County Public High School. (includes 2 foreign languages and a 3.5 weighted GPA)

#### Credits Continued

- Grade 9 Successful completion of middle school.
- Grade 10 Successful completion of 6 of the required graduation credits

  Successful completion of intervention/enrichment

  Complete and signed Transcript Analysis
- Grade 11 Successful completion of 12 of the required graduation credits

  Successful completion of intervention/enrichment

  Complete and signed Transcript Analysis
- Grade 12 Successful completion of 18 of the required graduation credits

  Successful completion of intervention/enrichment

  Must be able to complete graduation requirements by the end of the school term

# Class Rankings

- Beginning with the Freshman Class of 2022 (Senior Class of 2025) and after, only a class Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be named.
- All other seniors will be ranked by Honor for Academic Achievement.
- Honor for Academic Achievement will be based on cumulative, weighted grade point average and determined at the end of Senior Year.
- ▶ The Honor for Academic Achievement categories are:
- SUMMA CUM LAUDE (With Highest Praise) GPA 4.0 and Above MAGNA CUM LAUDE (With Great Honor) – GPA 3.50 to 3.99
- CUM LAUDE (With Honor) GPA 3.00 to 3.49

# Class Rankings Continued

- ▶ To be recognized as a SUMMA CUM LAUDE or MAGNA CUM LAUDE graduate, students must complete the core, elective, and GPA requirements for the Diploma with Advanced Honors endorsement.
- ▶ Students who do not meet the course or GPA requirements for the Diploma with Advanced Honors Endorsement will be recognized as CUM LAUDE graduates; provided they meet the GPA requirements (3.00-3.49).
- ► The Honors for Academic Achievement classification system for Seniors is designed to allow more students to be recognized for their academic achievements regardless of their chosen diploma track. (Board Approved Fall 2021).

# Credential VS College & Career Ready Indicator

- Credential- document showing the student is job-ready upon high school completion. (ex. Certificate in Hospitality & Tourism, Automotive Technology, welding)
- College & Career Ready Indicator-
  - 1. Benchmark in an area on the ACT- English 18, Reading 22, Math
  - **22**, Science **23**
  - 2. Enlist in the Military
  - 3. Take Work Keys and score a 4 or higher
  - 4. Earn college credit through dual enrollment

## Student's progress in class

#### **Bishop State Dual Enrollment**

Dual enrollment allows eligible high school students to earn credit toward a college certificate or degree program while satisfying high school graduation requirements. Students can complete colleges courses at one of Bishop State's campuses, online, or at their high school.

#### **Dual Enrollment Admissions General Requirements**

- Students must be in grade 10, 11, or 12.
- Students must have a minimum unweighted GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Students must meet established college placement criteria and/or other course prerequisites prior to enrolling in dual credit courses.

#### **Dual Enrollment Admissions Process**

<u>Step 1:</u> Speak with your guidance counselor about your interest in dual enrollment and to confirm admissions requirements, course needs, and scheduling.

<u>Step 2:</u> To complete an application for admission, visit the following: <a href="https://www.bishop.edu/new-students/apply-now">https://www.bishop.edu/new-students/apply-now</a>. Select *Dual Enrolled High School Student* as your student type. Select the academic term you wish to begin taking courses.
