My time as Superintendent of Liberty Center Local Schools began January 2, 2019. Since that time, I have had the privilege and opportunity to meet several students, staff and community members. My family and I have been truly impressed and grateful for the warm welcome that we have received. We are in the process of building a home in Liberty Center and are looking forward to putting down roots and becoming members of this community.

Construction Update: We are in the final stage of the construction process of the new K-12 building. While the building has been occupied for over a year, we are working diligently to address any construction issues prior to closing out the project. If everything goes according to plan, the project will be closed out this summer. It's a beautiful facility and something of which the Liberty Center community can be very proud for many years to come.

Veteran's Memorial Project:

The construction of a new Veteran's Memorial at the corner of Young St. and St. Rt. 109 will begin as soon as the ground is fit. The Liberty Center Education Foundation has sold over 187 pavers to be installed as part of this memorial. The pavers and memorial head stone from the old elementary reading circle will also be incorporated in the design. The goal is to have the project completed before Memorial Day.

Early 5's Program:

A new Early 5's program will be offered for the 2019/20 school year. The all day, every day program will provide children with an opportunity to work on their physical, social, emotional, and intellectual skills in a more developmentally appropriate setting. Children will be placed in the Early 5's program for a variety of reasons, but mostly because they are simply not ready for the demands placed on them by a traditional kindergarten classroom. It will act as a bridge for children who need an extra year between preschool and kindergarten. If you have any questions about the new program, please contact the Elementary Office at 419-533-2604.

The threat of fraud is something we are constantly challenged with, both personally and professionally. The State laws and regulations for school finance are constantly changing and evolving to help districts prevent fraud. As a district, it is our duty to be diligent with the school's funds, and my staff and I attend trainings on fraud so we can learn how to recognize potential threats.

Whether we like it or not, technology is the way of life. It is how we communicate, function and process transactions in school finance. But it also comes with added risks. One of the greatest threats that has been frequently discussed is ransomware. Ransomware is a type of malicious software that can infect a computer and block access to all of your files or computer until a ransom is paid. These can be delivered via email or a malicious website. Phishing emails tend to appear genuine, but if you look closely, the spelling might be slightly different with a word transposed, or if you hover over a link, it might actually direct you to a malicious website. They are attempting to get you to provide personal or secure information or infect your computer. Spoof emails are also common. They are an attempt to appear as an email from a co-worker or administrator requesting an immediate payment or a report with confidential information. Again, these are just a few examples that we have learned about during our fraud trainings.

Chances are likely that you have experienced fraudsters attempting to steal your personal information, whether it be via email, a website, or a phone call. Please keep the following in mind: be careful using public Wi-Fi networks, keep your passwords unique and secure, do not

divulge personal information, and lastly, if something does not seem right, chances are it's not!

Kindergarten Clinic

Beginning April 1, 2019, all parents of children who will be 5 years old by August 1, 2019 and live in the Liberty Center School District are asked to phone the Liberty Center Elementary School at 419-533-2604, to register their child for kindergarten next year. When you call to set up your appointment we will need the following information: your child's name and date of birth, parents' names, address, and phone number. There will be an Early 5s Program geared towards children who turn 5 between May 1st and August 1st or are not ready for the demands of a kindergarten classroom. An informational meeting on the Early 5s program will be held on April 16th at 6:00 p.m. in the Elementary Media Center.

Our clinic will be held Thursday, May 2nd and Friday May, 3rd at the school. Please plan on the appointment taking approximately 1 ½ hours. It is imperative that you attend this clinic with your child. We are required by law to screen each child before kindergarten. Typically this means that children who do not go through screening in the spring will need to be brought in by parents during the first day of school in the fall to complete the screening process before they can begin regular school attendance.

Entering school for the first time is exciting for both the child and parent. We look forward to working with you and your child to make this experience a memorable one for many years.



Middle/High School Spring Testing

Spring is finally here and that means we will soon be participating in the State of Ohio's testing. In an effort to reduce the amount of time spent testing and to provide more time teaching and learning, as a district, Liberty Center is administering the tests differently this year.

During the testing dates, we ask that you would encourage your student to get a good night's sleep, eat a healthy breakfast and, most importantly, be at school. Please refrain from making appointments during this time so that your student can have the best chance of success. Chromebooks will need to be charged each testing day prior to coming to school. Additional chromebook chargers may not be available for students during testing.

Testing will begin on Monday, April 15th and wrap up on Friday, April 26th, with Easter break falling in on April 19-22nd. Here are the dates that your student will test along with the test they will be taking:

Each testing day grades 5-12 will be on a 2-hour delay schedule. We will give the test during the 2-hour delay and then we will have a normal school day once testing is complete.

If your student is NOT scheduled for a test, then they may stay home during the delay; however, the busses will only run at their normally scheduled time. The busses will NOT run at a 2-hour delay time. If you wish to send your student into school on the bus, we will provide educational programs, a space for them to do homework or to enjoy the opportunity of some free time.

Teachers reserve the right to require students to attend school during non-testing times. These students will receive direct assistance from their teacher to equip them to be as successful as possible on the State Tests.
