I want to address a recent rumor circulating about a potential merger involving Oak Run and the Whitmore School District. I want to be clear: this rumor is false in regard to Oak Run.

I have spoken directly with the superintendent of Whitmore and Mountain Union, and it is true that those two school districts are in discussions about a possible consolidation. However, Oak Run has not been involved in these talks in any way. To my knowledge we have not been contacted about participating in a merger, nor have we reached out to express an interest in a merger. The only conversation with Whitmore has been to get the facts in order to address the merger rumor.

Furthermore, according to the superintendent involved in those merger discussions, Shasta County Office of Education is not participating in any decisions regarding that matter.

We are committed to keeping you informed and we will provide you with timely and accurate information.



This week was a fun week. We celebrated Earth Day on Tuesday, but we talked about taking care of the earth all week long. We talked about saving resources like turning off our lights when leaving a room, keeping doors closed or even turning off the water when we're brushing our teeth. We talked about reducing waste like using a reusable water bottle, which we already do in class, and using both sides of a piece of paper. We also talked about recycling and donating used things like clothes instead of throwing things away. It is a good week for us to think about how to better care for our earth.

In science, we are learning about echoes and how sound is made. We are learning about sound waves, and that they move in all directions. When they hit a hard flat surface, they bounce back. We learned how dolphins and whales use echolocation to find out where they are and how to look for food.

In social studies, we learned about the different continents, where they are on a map of the world and what each continent is known for. We talked about what we liked about each continent and where we would like to see when we visited! We have such a fascinating, amazing and huge world that we live in!

In math, there is so much to learn! In kindergarten, we are learning about length, height and weight. In first grade, we are measuring lengths from shortest to longest. And second grade, we are learning how to use bar graphs and how they can help us. And third grade we are continuing on with fractions

In language arts, Kindergarten is focusing on short vowel sounds and how to read them in words. In first grade, we started off the week with reviewing things that we've already gone over and have now started in the second half with plurals ending with 's' or ending with 'es'. In second grade, we are learning this week about past tense verbs, and even some irregular past tense verbs like run and ran. In third grade, we are also talking about regular and irregular past tense verbs and how to write them and use them correctly. We are also starting our next unit on contractions. Isn't that great!
