Fall Sports Report

Teams battle adversity with COVID quaratines while trying to rise to the top

As the fall season began in August, athletes and coaches were ready to start a normal year of competition. After a strong start in all fall sports, volleyball and football were both placed on a two week quaratine due to covid exposures, which halted their momentum.

Football won their first game of the season prior to the quarantine but were not able to rebound to any victories after that. Injuries late in the season forced the Loggers to cancel their last scheduled game.

The Cross Country teams continue to turn in strong performances. The girls team has especially turned in strong performances. Vernonia girls were ranked #2 in the state and have won the last 5 meets they have competed in. This includes the prestigious 45th annual Harvest Classic in Longview, and the Vernonia Invitational which consisted of 17 teams at the 3A/2A/1A level. A top 3 finish at district on October 29th will ensure the team a trip to the state meet in Eugene on November 6th. If they can pull this off, it would be the first time our girls made it to the state meet as a full team. The boys team is currently ranked

#6 in the state and 3rd in District 1. It will take a top two finish at district for them to make it back to the state meet, where they finished 5th overall last spring. Update: Octber 29th Vernonia girls won the district meet, boys took 3rd, and Coach Roady picked up coach up the year. The girls team advanced to the state meet where they tied for 1st, but a tie breaking decision moved them to 2nd. Despite that this was the best showing for the girls' cross country team from Vernonia!

Volleyball took some hits as the team eased back into competitive play. As players returned, lineups shifted to fill holes and find the most competitive mixture of girls that were able to recoup early season losses to Portland Christian and Gaston in the district playoffs. The Lady Loggers took down Faith Bible, Portland Christian in a 3-0 sweep, and eventually the #2 state ranked Gaston for the district tournament championship, which earned them hosting a 1st round state playoff game. The Lady Loggers hosted Reedsport (21-8) on October 30th. After a slow start, and losing their starting

middle blocker to a rolled ankle in the first set the team was able to come back from the first set loss and take the next three. The win advanced them to the second round in John Day against the Prospectors. After making the long trip to John Day the Lady Loggers would fall to Grant Union 3-1, a team they beat early on in the season. In a normal year the girls would have had another opportunity to win a trophy but due to COVID protocols the OSAA opted to take only 4 teams to the big tournament in Redmond.

Middle school teams finished their seasons with great success. The volleyball team won many of their matches, and football played competitively in all games. They won their last game against Rainier by a convincing 20-7 margin.

Tax Incentives

If you itemize your deductions, the adjusted gross income (AGI) for cash contributions made to qualifying charities in 2021 remains increased for individual donors. You can elect to deduct up to 100 per cent of your AGI.

If you do **not** itemize your deductions, single taxpayers may take an "above-the-line" deduction up to \$300. Married couples, filing jointly, will be allowed to take an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600 in cash contributions to charities for 2021.

The Vernonia Boosters is a 501(c)(3) organization; thus, all contributions are tax-deductible.

What's missing? What do we need?



A Covered Stadium for students and fans:

- ✓ It rains once in a while in Vernonia; our students, local fans and visitors need to stay warm and dry during home games and meets;
- ✓ Community members and students need a gathering place to support their teams:
- ✓ For track meets: Safety and control issue: our fans need to sit in one place and not interfere with track and field events;
- ✓ Big enough to share with visitors 900 seat capacity large enough to host playoff games and regional meets
- ✓ Seating and access for all fans young, old and disabled.
- ✓ Estimated Price Tag: \$650K

Concession Stand and Restrooms:

- ✓ Students and Fans may wish to eat and drink during games and meets;
- ✓ Students and Fans may need to use adequate clean facilities during games and meets; (instead of the current, rented Port-a-Potties).
- ✓ Vernonia Boosters need to provide fundraising opportunities for student and local groups to support youth sports in the community;
- ✓ Centrally located to accommodate all outdoor sports at Vernonia schools.
- ✓ Estimated Price Tag: \$250K

Extra Enhancements:

- ✓ Restroom facilities closer to the seating at Stadium;
- ✓ Teams and Coaches can gather during halftime under the seating;
- ✓ Secure Storage Facilities under seating.
- ✓ Estimated Price Tag: \$150K
