Bienvenue! Welcome to French!

Bonjour Students and Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back to school and to a wonderful year of French! I am excited to have you in my class. Please read the following carefully as you will be responsible for all the material in the syllabus.

Course Description:

This level I Language course focuses on the development of communicative competence in French and understanding of the culture (s) of the people who speak the language. It assumes that students have minimal or no prior knowledge of the language and culture. By the end of Level I, students will exhibit Novice-Mid level proficiency in speaking and writing and Novice-High level proficiency in listening, and reading (ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines, 1999)

Course Objectives:

Course Goals:

Upon completing the French 1 course, students should be able to:

- 1. Communicate in the target language
- 2. Gain knowledge and understanding of other cultures
- 3. Connect with other disciplines and acquire information
- 4. Develop insight into the nature of language and culture
- 5. Participate in multicultural communities at home and around the world

Textbooks:

"As a student of this course, you will be required to complete assigned reading and tasks from the listed text(s). (EntreCultures 1 - Wayside Publishing). You must have uninterrupted access to the text's material. We offer the assigned text in both digital and hardcopy formats. You may choose not to request a hardcopy and in doing so fully understand it is your responsibility to maintain digital access to the text's material. If at any time you or your teacher feel you cannot guarantee this, a hardcopy will be issued to you. If the hardcopy text becomes damaged or lost, you will be responsible for the cost of replacement (as set by HCBOE)."

Materials:

The following is a list of materials for this class:

- Three ring binder or folders, index cards
- Blue or black pens, pencils & highlighters
- Chrome Book

<u>Chrome book statement:</u> "All students are issued a district-provided chrome book for instructional purposes, student engagement, and student learning. Chrome book use is at the direction and discretion of the classroom teacher."

Grades:

- 1. You may always check your grades on Infinite Campus. Please see the counselor's office if you are having trouble with Infinite Campus. Since you have access to your grades from the Internet, please do not ask me for your grades.
- 2. You are allowed to retake 2 major tests, in which you earned a failing grade, per semester. However, you must attend tutoring before taking the exam. Additionally, a "re-test" cannot replace a zero for a task never initially completed.

Grades will be computed as follows:

- 1. Daily work (15%)
- 2. Minor Assessments (20%)
- 3. Major Assessments (45%)
- 4. Final Assessment (20%)

*The final Assessment will be cumulative.

Late work

Late work in this class is anything turned in after I have collected an assignment. Late work will be accepted for five days after the assignment has been collected with a 10-point deduction for each day. After five days, the work will not be accepted. Any assignment being handed in before or after class must be handed to me personally.

Bonus Points

The teacher will sometimes include a few bonus questions on tests or quizzes, and points will be added to the student's score. These questions may be vocabulary or cultural trivia that enhance our French standards and curriculum. Bonus points are a way to reward students who are paying attention and participating in class. There is no magical "Extra Credit Assignment" at the end of the semester to add points to a student's average.

Tutoring:

If needed, students will have the opportunity to be tutored on Mondays and Fridays from 3:00-3:30.

Google Classroom

To encourage blended learning, online assignments will be posted weekly through Google Classroom. At least one Google Classroom assignment per week will be graded and entered in Infinite Campus. Students should be familiar with how to navigate the online platform, communicate with their teacher, and submit assignments on time. If there are technological limitations, please notify the teacher.

Cyberbullying:

As defined by Dictionary.com, "the act of harassing someone online by sending or posting means messages." Please keep in mind that the Edmodo communication system is designed to work as an extension of the classroom; therefore, anything done on the site through the access of a school course group code will be treated the same as if it were said aloud in the classroom. Inappropriate comments or use of the site can result in disciplinary action.

Cheating and plagiarism:

The academic integrity of courses at VHS is of the utmost importance; as such, cheating or academic dishonesty will not be tolerated.

Tardies and Absences:

- 1. Be in your seat when the bell rings; otherwise, you will be counted tardy. (3 unexcused tardies = 1 absence). See page 8 in your student handbook for tardy policy.
- 2. If you are absent from this class, you must make sure that your absence is excused through the office before I allow you to make-up the work. You have five days to do make-up work. Please see page 9-10 in your student handbook for attendance policy.
- 3. If you have been given an extended outline detailing the assignments for several days, you will still be responsible for taking exams or any other assignments that could occur on the day you return to class. Also, any major project or paper assigned in advance must still be turned in on the due date even if you are absent.

Behavior:

- Be respectful to all people including you, the classroom, and all materials.
- Gum, food or drinks are not allowed in the classroom (except for water).
- Sleeping in class is not allowed
- Daily participation is necessary for successful acquisition of language skills. Be present and punctual.
- Be on time, be prepared, be on task.
