Summer Reading Requirements and Reading Lists Franklin County High School English Department

Requirements

- Overview:
 - All honors courses are accelerated classes designed for the student who excels in language and literature and who is willing to do more work than the state curriculum mandates. These classes are feeder classes for Advanced Placement (AP) English.
- <u>Incoming freshmen</u> will be accepted into the honors program based upon a qualifying EOC score, a qualifying score on the honors entrance exam, and the fulfillment of the summer reading requirements listed below.

Summer Reading, Test, and Essay

- Acquisition of books for summer reading is each student's responsibility; however, you
 may email the grade level teacher if securing books is an issue.
- To enhance your reading and understanding of the texts, the English department recommends that you annotate your books as you read. Annotating includes underlining significant passages, making notes, or asking questions in the margins of the book.
- On the second full day of school (during class if you have English first semester and after school if you have English second semester), you will be given an assessment that covers each summer reading book. Any make-up sessions or other late work will be allowed at the discretion of the teacher. This assessment will make up a percentage of your grade for the semester.
