From the principal

I wanted to thank all the teachers who have recently been giving us input on our seniors who are currently on track to be an A-G completer but may have stumbled at the beginning of the year. We started off this school year with approximately 290 seniors on pace to be a "completer" in June. At the first grade check we had about 60 of those students in jeopardy of falling off pace. We have been asking the students and their teachers for input on what is causing these students to struggle. We have also been making phone calls home to the students' parents. We are learning a lot about what is going on in these kids and what interventions might help them be successful. If we can retain most of these "on track" seniors we will see an all-time high in A-G completion rates, but more importantly, we will have succeeded in assisting more students in becoming UC/CSU eligible.

From Curriculum & Instruction (Asst Principal Monica Pallan)

This past Wednesday to Friday, October 26-28, we had our first annual College Trip in Southern California. 53 Seniors spent 3 days touring 9 universities. Students experienced a variety of campuses from private to public, ranging in size from 3,000 to 45,000. From Special Programs Office (Asst Principal Tim Vincent)


