

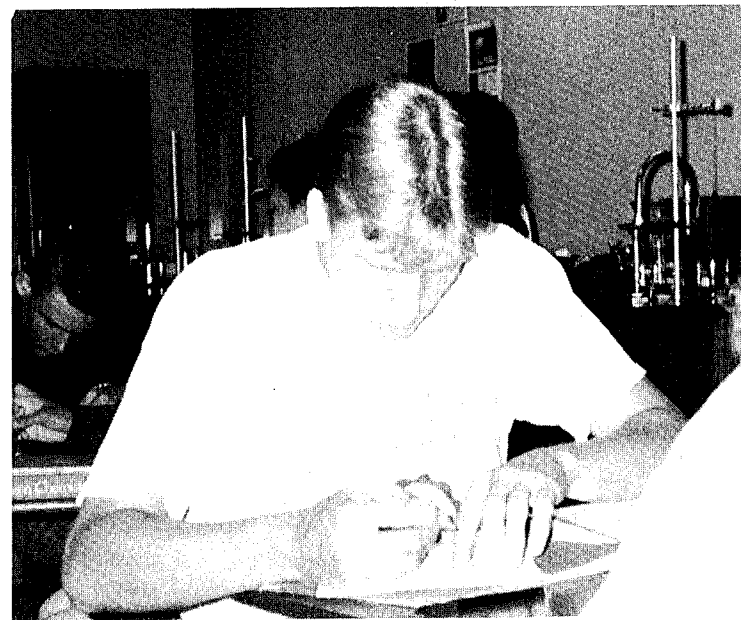
EXPERIMENT

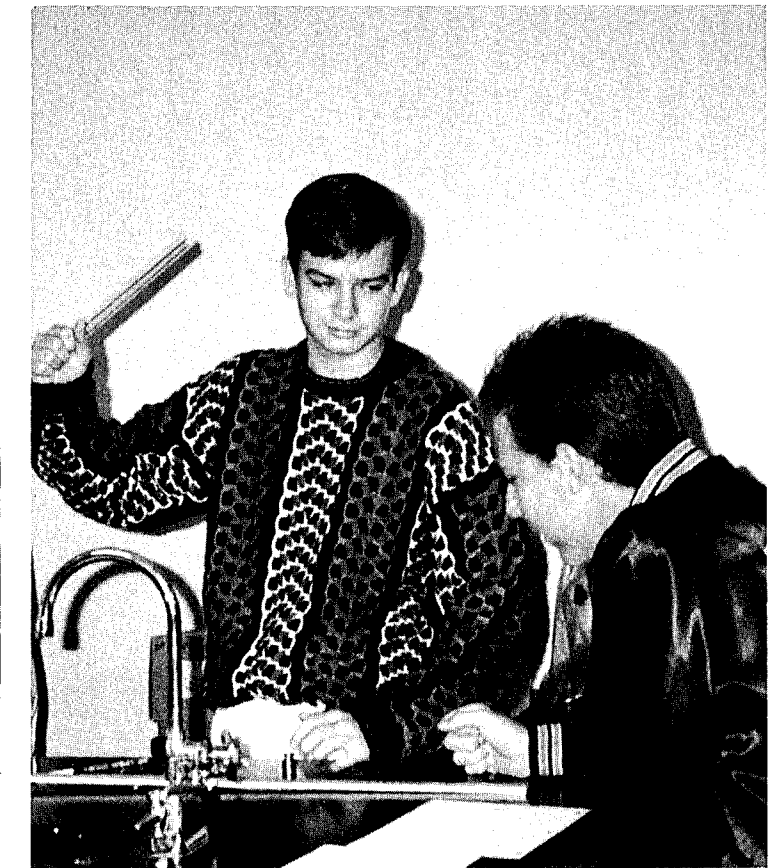

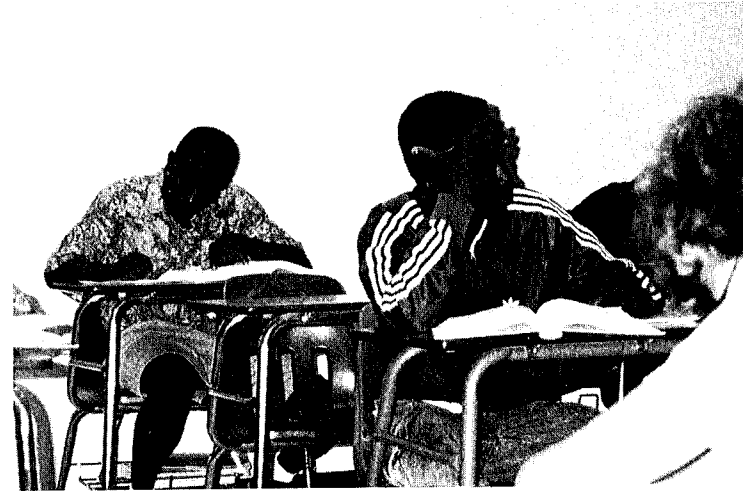

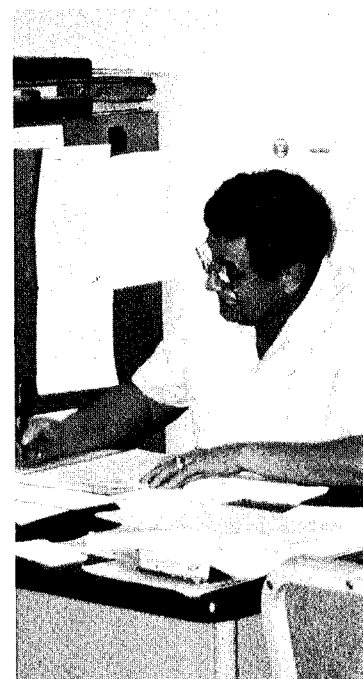

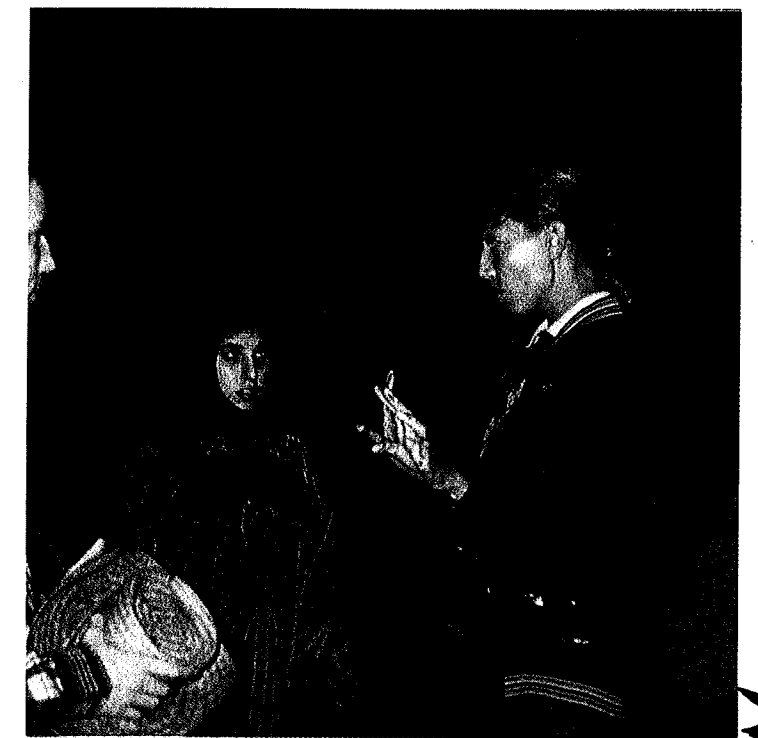
On Stage

Although just her first time directing, she said, "I expected the play to be real good, but it was better than I thought it would be. I thought it was neat how the kids put their personalities into their characters."

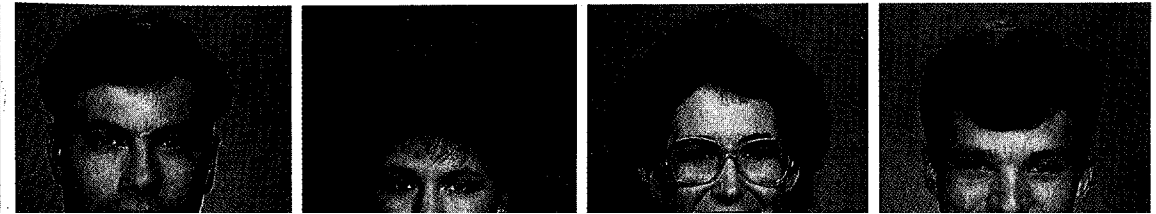
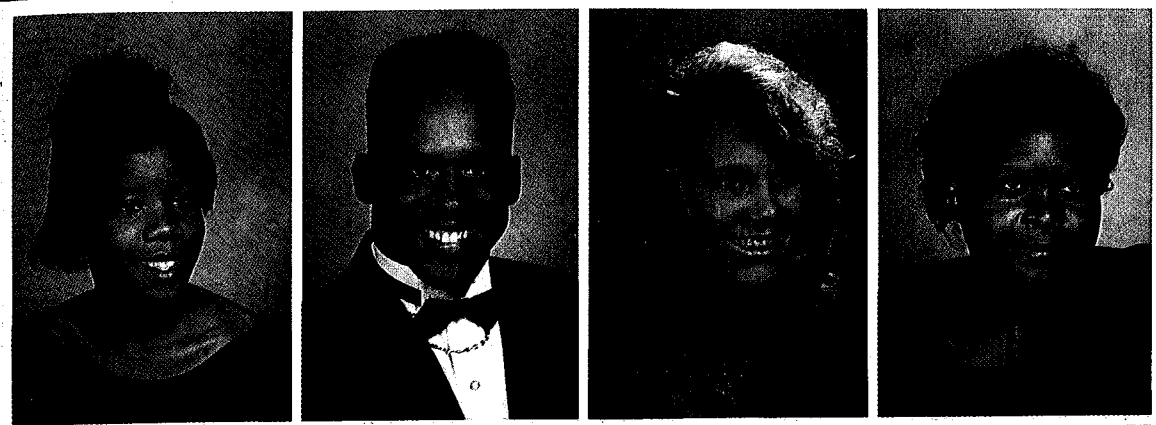
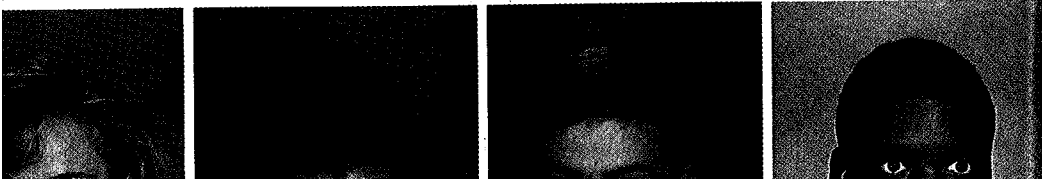
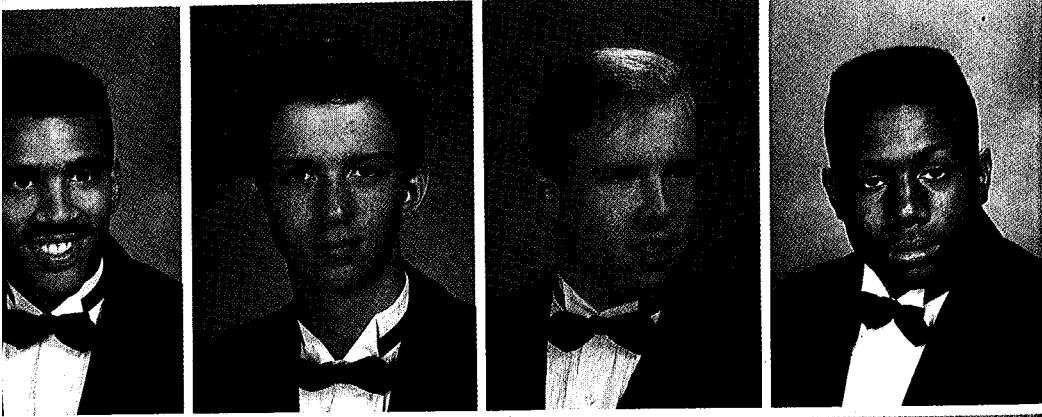
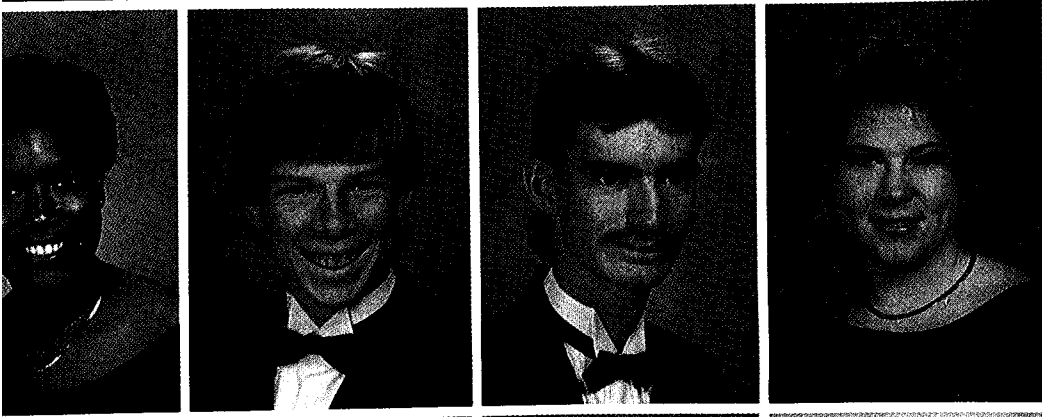
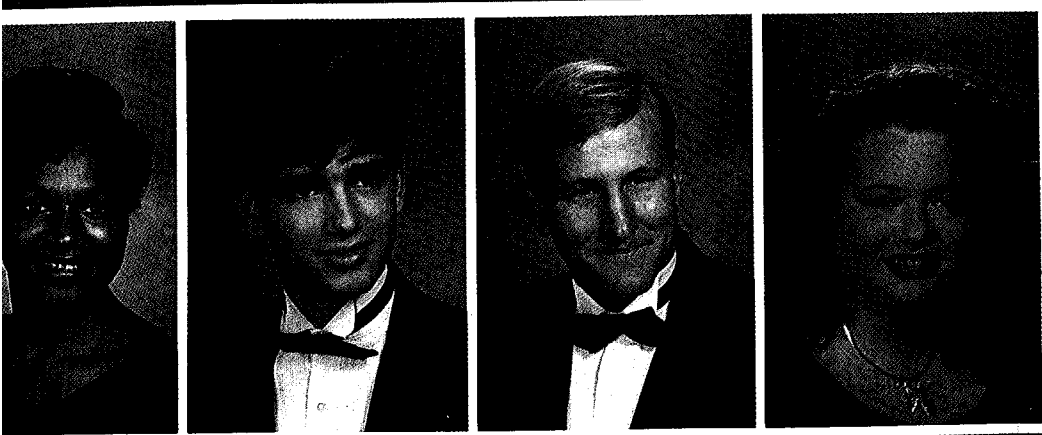

Sitting on top of the roof, the band consists of Rusty Ingley, Chris Keefer, Dylan McKeeman, and Ellen Dopler.



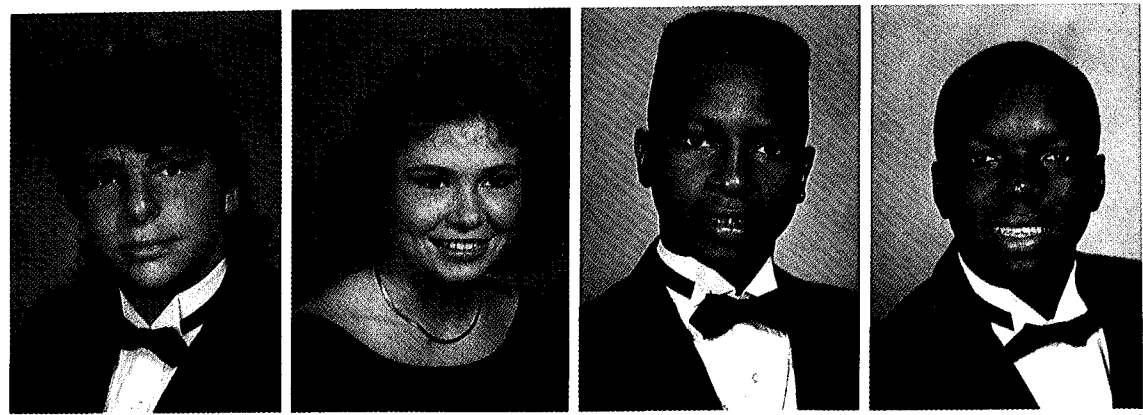

Despite the band's worst moment when their neighbor shot down one of their performances, they have kept on playing. In fact

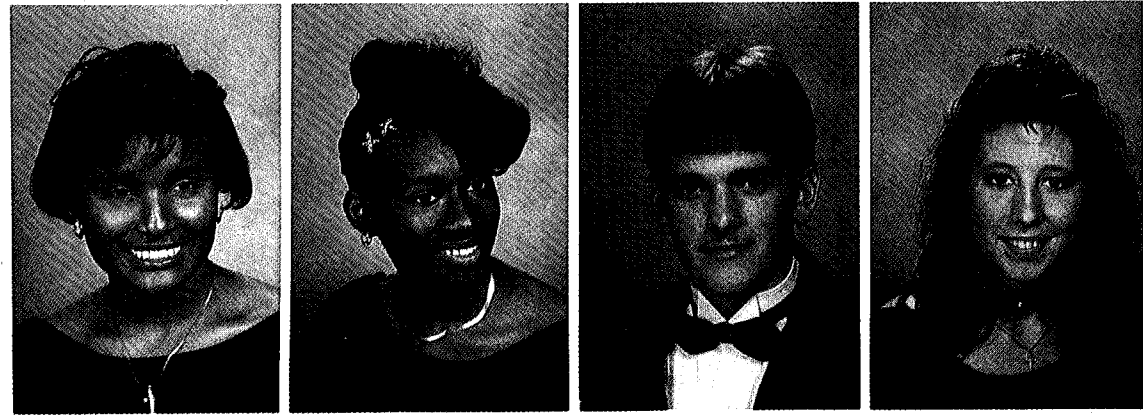

Just like the real Supreme Court, they reviewed the constitutionality of laws. And just like the real Justices, they argued until a majority decision was made.

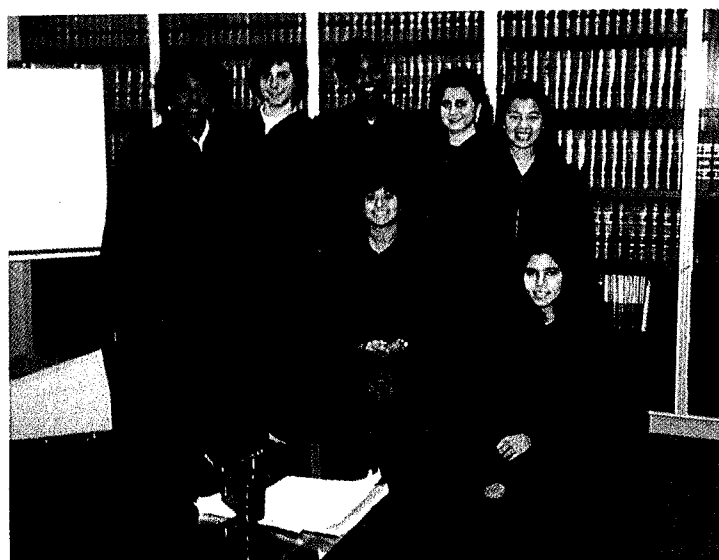
Telling of her experience, Mon-

EXTRAUAGENT Sophomores

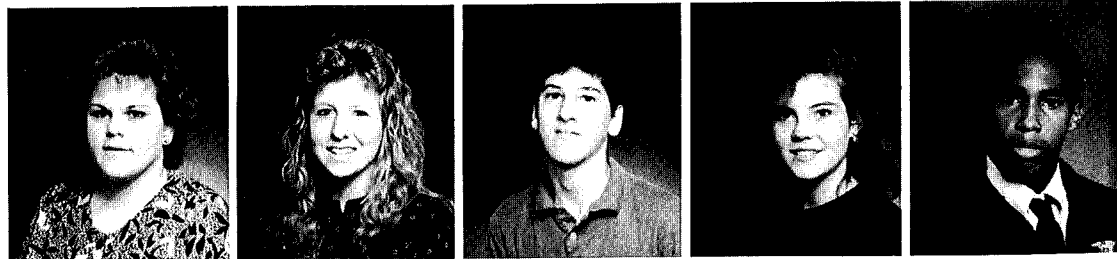

Carrying On The Tradition



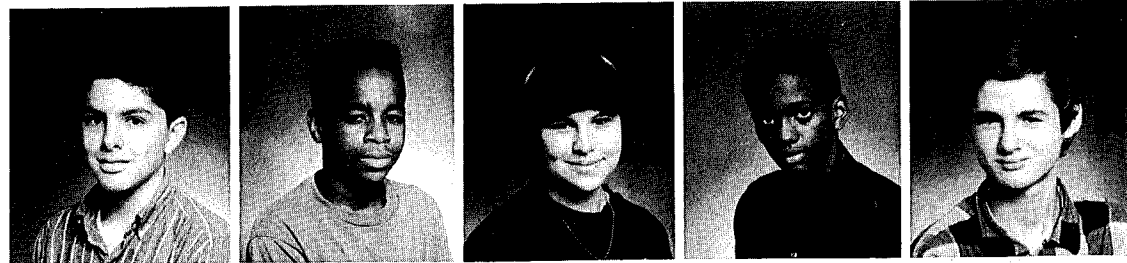

Faced with one of the tougher schedules in the district and haunted by inaccurate rumors of an incapable young team, the Highlanders played with pride. This was shown in great victories,

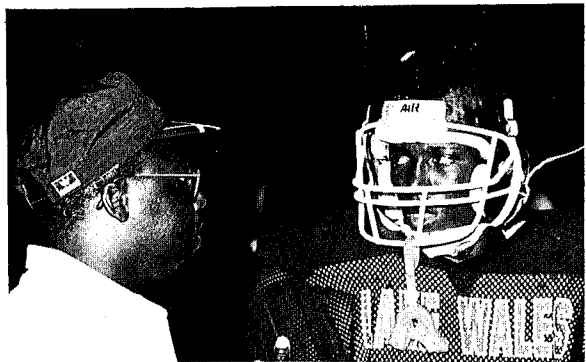

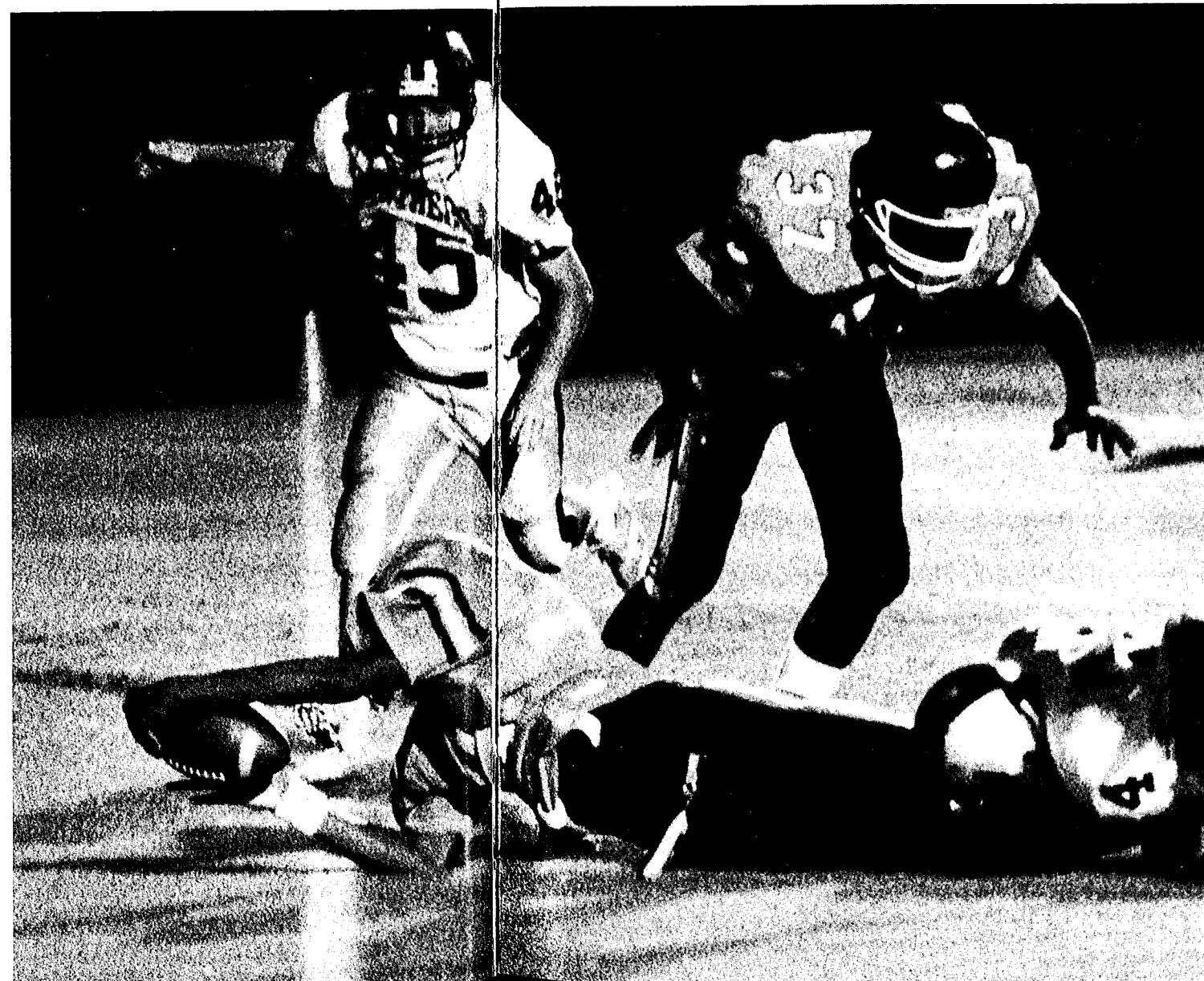

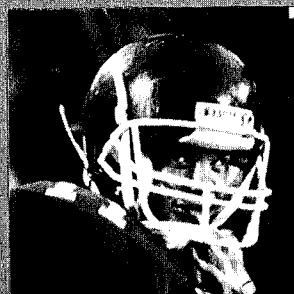

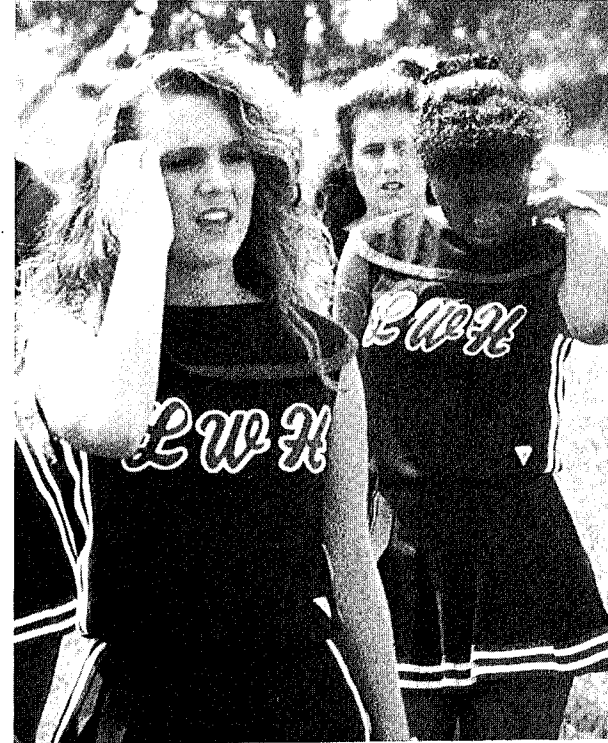

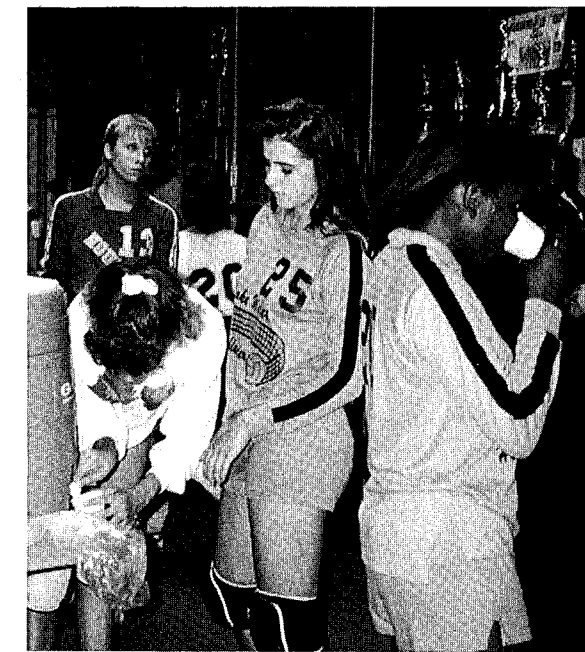

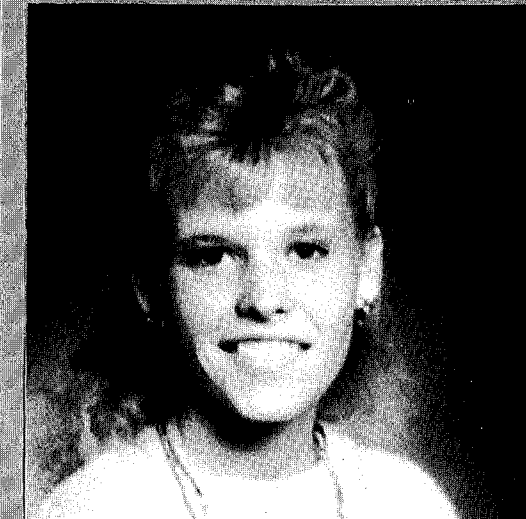
