POLICY REGARDING

**NUMBER OF TRANSFER STUDENTS ACCEPTED BY GRADE
& DEADLINE TO APPLY**

The Tri-Township Consolidated School Corporation has set the number of transfer students the Corporation has the capacity to accept per grade level for the 2017-2018 school year as follows:

A non-resident student must submit a request to enroll at LaCrosse High School or Wanatah Elementary/Middle School to the Superintendent by February 15, 2018 for 2017-2018 school year. However, this policy does not prohibit students seeking to transfer to LaCrosse High School or Wanatah Elementary/Middle School throughout the school year from enrolling, so long as the above capacity limits are not exceeded. If the number of requests to transfer, exceed the above capacity limits, students will be chosen based on a random drawing at a public meeting. Students may not however, request a transfer primarily for an athletic reason.

The Corporation will not deny a request for transfer (providing the student does not meet the criteria below under “Denial of Enrollment”) for students who already have a member of their household attending a school within the Corporation or have a parent who is an employee of the Corporation.

The Corporation will accept students solely on the basis of the capacity limits and may deny students only when they meet the criteria specified under Denial of Enrollment or when the capacity limits set forth above are exceeded.

Denial of Enrollment:

The Corporation may deny a request to transfer if:

The student has been suspended or expelled under IC 20-33-8-3 during the previous 12 months:

- For ten or more school days including days under IC 20-33-25(b)(7),
- For a violation under IC 20-33-8-16 (Possession of firearms, deadly weapons, or destructive devices),
- For causing physical injury to a student, a school employee, or a visitor to the school, or
- For a violation of the Corporation's drug or alcohol rules.

The Corporation may deny transfer into the school district if the student has a history of unexcused absences and would potentially pose a problem of low attendance.

The parent/guardian must provide the Corporation with discipline and attendance records of the student so the school administration may determine whether the student meets the criteria under which a student maybe denied enrollment.
