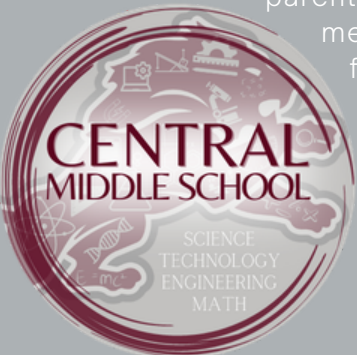

What is Title I?

Central Middle is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title 1 is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title 1 programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title 1 schools must jointly develop with parents and family members in a written family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement



What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Central Middle will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Central Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Central Middle will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

The Parent and Family Engagement Plan is jointly developed and revised annually. This year, Central Middle School invited all parents to attend an input session on April 27, 2026 at 9:30 am and 12:00 pm, to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as, build staff capacity for the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, family engagement budget, and our 1% parenting budget. Additionally, the plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online, or one can request a paper copy. This survey allows parents and family members an additional format to provide feedback to the school. Parents and family members are also provided the opportunity to give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Curriculum Nights. Meetings are held at a variety of times throughout the school year or virtually in hopes of including those who may not be available to attend sessions at CMS but can attend and give feedback virtually. Parents/guardians can also request home visits, individual meetings, or group meetings to accommodate parent/guardian needs. Please contact Maggie Bonner to set up an appointment date and time. Parents are welcome to submit comments and feedback regarding the policy at any time on the school district website or by submitting written comments to their child's school. All feedback received by August was included in the policy for this school year. If you have any concerns about the FEP policy that are not addressed by CMS, please contact the Director of Federal Programs, Heather Duke.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Central Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, disabilities, and migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, a copy of the Parent and Family Engagement Plan is given to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Parents will be informed via social media that the plan was sent home with the students and is available on the website. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Area.

2026-2027 District & CMS Goals

CMS administrators, teachers, & parents have analyzed our student performance data to determine the following goals for the 2026-2027 school year.

- Increase content mastery in reading to 70% proficient and distinguished
- Implementation of closing the gaps strategies to decrease the number of students in the beginning learner band in all subject areas

2026-2027 School Goals

The Carroll County Board of Education establishes goals for the entire school system. The goals for the 2026-2027 school year include:

- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies End-of-Grade Assessments will increase by 3%.
- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) in subgroup categories of economically disadvantaged, Students with Disabilities, and English Language students will increase in each area by 3%.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Central Middle and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on the feedback from parents, students, and teachers **during the Input Session on April 27, 2026, at 9:30 am and 12:00 pm.**

The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and is posted on the school website.

Central Middle is Branching Out!

Central Middle will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

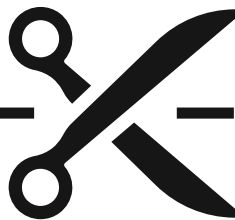

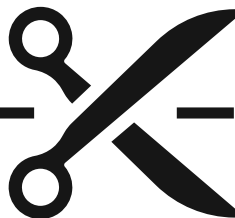
