



UPCOMING ACTIVITIES

12th Grade Career Center Visits: Seniors will be visiting the Career Center (September 26-28th) to look over valuable resources that will assist them during this year.

11th Grade Career Center Visits: Juniors will spend approximately 30 minutes (September 12-16) learning about the resources available in the Career Center. Learn more about our Career Center: LHHS Career Center

9th Grade Meet Your Counselor Lessons: Counselors will be meeting with 9th graders during their PE periods on October 6th and 7th to introduce themselves and provide the students with information on how to set up an appointment with their counselor, as well as learn what their counselors are here to support with.

PSAT: The Practice SAT test will be held on October 15th. Space is limited and restricted to Sophomores and Juniors only. The test will be \$25.00, which can be paid at the LHHS Bookstore. Please ensure your student signs up for the PSAT by September 30th.

PAYING FOR POST SECONDARY INSTITUTION:

Seniors (and their parents) will want to complete the FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Our goal is to assist those students/parents in the completion of the application and will offer time in the seniors' school day to address this.

FAFSA lesson (seniors): During the month of October, throughout the school day. On October 3rd, we will offer a Parent Workshop (6:00 p.m, LHHS Library) to assist in the completion of FAFSA. More details to follow.

Parents are always welcomed to visit the Career Center.

Future planning is critical to ensure that students meet graduation requirements, have knowledge about programs of study and are able to pursue their post-secondary goals.
