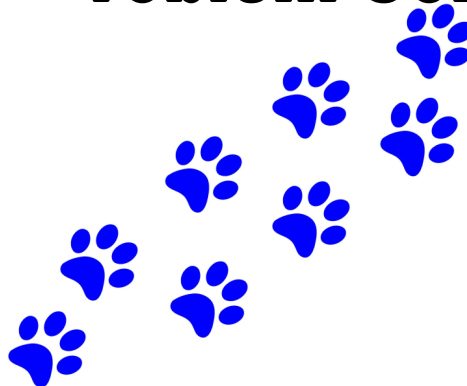
Our Goal for Student Achievement
