School Responsibilities

Collier Elementary will:

- Once per semester (school requirement) in person (or by phone when needed)
- By teacher or parent request

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

- Mid-term progress reports and quarterly report cards.
- Monthly progress reports or communication with academic difficulty.
- Parents are provided information to access student data through Schoology.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- By scheduled appointment
- By email, phone call, Schoology, Remind IOI during planning times and/or before and after school as requested

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Planned events and extra-curricular activities
- Honors days and special holiday events

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

- Translate vital information in print and email (in home language)
- Provide translator for parent conferences (verbal/sign language)

Parent Responsibilities

- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
