

What is a Title I School?

- Title I is the nation's largest assistance program for schools.
- It provides funding for increasing student achievement in schools selected on the basis of the economic level of families in the school's attendance zone.
- Title I funds supplement local and state educational programs to ensure that all students achieve in all academic areas.

How does WRHS spend Title I Funds?

- Staff: WRHS employs 2 Intervention Specialists, Family Engagement Liaison, Educational Coach, and a Classroom Reduction Size Teacher
- Technology: Google Chrome books and TI 84 graphing calculators.
- Supplemental software: Kuta, USA Test Prep, Problem-Attic, Daniel I.O., and Gizmos
- Supplies
- Books and Materials for the classrooms
- Professional development for faculty and staff.
