Dear Parishioners,

Thank you to everyone who helped make our recent festival a success—those who cleaned the Church of St. Edward, volunteered, served, cooked, attended, ate, took part in activities, and simply enjoyed the day.

While we are still finalizing the numbers, we know that the festival is not primarily a fundraiser. Its true value lies in the sense of community, joy, and togetherness it fosters. A well-run festival reminds us of the blessing of belonging to a parish family—and I hope everyone who attended experienced a little of that joy.

The renovation of St. Edward's Church is also drawing near to

completion. I admit that I am overwhelmed by the simple, sacred beauty of our renewed sanctuary. As I walked toward the altar recently, seeing the end so near, I was nearly moved to tears. Thank you for your generosity, prayers, and support throughout this project.

Sadly, while we were celebrating here, we also witnessed a tragic event last week: the assassination of a political activist. It deeply grieves me that civil discourse has deteriorated to the point where some can see such violence as acceptable—or even celebrate it. Even more troubling are those who suggest that more violence should follow.

In my studies, I encountered the phrase "ad fontes" – "to the source" – a guiding principle of the 1920's liturgical movement. I believe that same spirit is needed today. Too often, we accept secondhand claims or echo the loudest voices online. If we took time to go directly to the source, we might see people and situations more clearly.

In this case, Mr. Kirk was labeled with harsh and hurtful accusations. Yet, for anyone who took the time to actually listen to him, it was evident that he sought dialogue—even when discussing difficult or controversial issues. Nothing he said or believed could ever justify his death.

We must move away from the echo chambers of the internet and back toward real relationships—speaking with others face-to-face, even when we disagree, and seeing in them the shared humanity that unites us. This is not always easy, but it is essential if we are to heal

as a society and live out Christ's call to love our neighbor.



Dear Parishioners,

On the back of this letter, you will find a summary of our year-end financial reports for the recently completed fiscal year, July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

A few general notes about these reports:

The new diocesan-mandated software requires that all capital income and expenses be reported as part of the year's income and expenses. This means that money raised in previous years for future renovations or improvements is reported as income in the year it was received, while the expenses are recorded in the year they are incurred. It was raised and recorded in previous years.

Both St. Eloi and St. Edward had significant capital expenses this past year:

- St. Eloi paid a \$33,500 down payment for the replacement of storm windows, with the balance to be paid in this current fiscal year.
- St. Edward had \$115,361 in capital campaign income last year, with \$309,379 in expenses for renovations. On paper, this shows a deficit of about \$194,018 just considering the campaign and projects. However, these expenses were fully covered by the Capital Campaign funds raised for that purpose. We have a separate report for the Capital Campaign moneys as we are starting to come to a close.

To help make things clearer, I have included additional notes following the reports, and will summarize them here, to explain the financial activity of each parish more specifically.

St. Edward:

When we adjust for the Capital Campaign income and renovation expenses, as well as the interest generated by our Church and School Endowments, you will see that we ended the year with a net operating deficit of \$84,275. To cover this, we were required to draw interest from our endowment funds.

As I shared in May and June, much of this deficit came from underbudgeting medical insurance and utilities. There were substantial increases in the parish's share of medical insurance premiums that were higher than expected.

Looking ahead, we have created a much more realistic and solid budget for the new fiscal year (July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026). We will still have about \$330,000 in remaining renovation expenses as projects are completed. This money is already in our Campaign account, but, as before, it will appear as expenses in this year's reports.

While last year closed with a deficit, we are confident that this year's improved budgeting will place St. Edward in a much stronger position. Our hope is to allow the endowment funds to grow, rather than relying on interest withdrawals to cover expenses.

St. Eloi

St. Eloi's financial reports also reflect the storm window project. The funds for this project were given and reported in the 2023–2024 fiscal year, while the actual expense appeared in the 2024–2025 fiscal year as we made an initial down payment.

When you look at the bottom line, St. Eloi shows a larger net profit than the report alone might initially suggest, once this timing difference is taken into account. We know that we have some other substantial repairs, so this surplus is very much helpful.

I want to thank you for your continued support of both of our parishes. Your generosity makes it possible for us to grow and serve our communities.

As we move forward, I invite you to continue to give generously. May the Lord inspire each of us to greater generosity and deeper service, as we answer His call to build up His Church.
