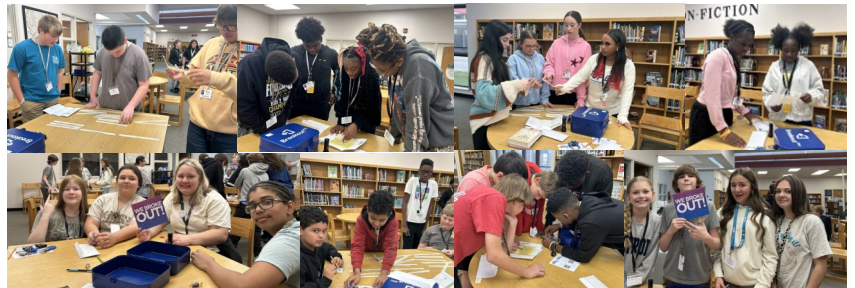


Super Readers Spotlight
