School Responsibilities

North Mobile County K-8 School will:

Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

Students will receive rigorous and enriching instruction on grade level standards by highly qualified teacher.

Parent teacher-conferences will be held at least annually for all students and as frequently as a parent request a conference.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

Parents will receive progress report sent home every three weeks and report cards sent home at the end of each quarter.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

Parents can schedule conferences with a teacher during their planning period by contacting the school or the teacher.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

Parents may volunteer in the classroom for special events that occur and may observe classes if an appointment is scheduled in advance with the teacher.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

Newsletters, as well as other forms of communication, are sent home monthly with all students. These provided information about upcoming events throughout the school. Parents can also email or call the school and/or teachers if needed.
