Dear NMPS Staff and Families:

First, we'd like to thank you for all of your efforts to keep our children well and able to attend school in person as often as possible. Recently, the number of children who have been affected by COVID-19 has risen in the community, and consequently, the number of children in quarantine has risen.

As you know, the New Milford Health Director Lisa Morrissey and I work closely together to make informed decisions regarding the state of NMPS. Currently, our guideline for quarantine has been 10 days with an option to test out on day five or later with a return on day 8. <u>This will</u> remain the practice. However, we are strongly recommending a 10 day quarantine for all students and staff until further notice.

Also of note, due to the increase in cases, we will be *pausing the Screen and Stay option*. As of today, December 8, 2021, this will no longer be an option for staff and families. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

"The New Milford Department of Health strongly encourages people to get vaccinated or get their booster shots if they have not done so already, especially for those who plan on attending social gatherings this holiday season", noted Lisa Morrissey, Director of Health for the Town of New Milford.

COVID-19 Recommendations






Quarantine for 10 days if exposed (unvaccinated).

Wear a mask in public, crowded places, and at social gatherings Get tested if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms

*We recognize that families may opt to use the shorter, approved quarantine guideline which requires a COVID-19 test on day 5 or later, with a return to school on day 8 following a negative result.








Practice proper hygiene (wash hands regularly, cover your mouth/nose when coughing and sneezing) Stay home if you are not feeling well

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DEFINITIONS







Close Contact

Someone who was less than 6 feet away from sick person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.

Quarantine

Keeps someone who was in close contact with someone with COVID-19 away from others.

Isolation

Keeps someone who is sick or tested positive for COVID-19 without symptoms away from others, even in their own home.

Screen & Stay


Allows unvaccinated individuals that were exposed to COVID-19 in school to attend school as long as they are asymptomatic and follow the proper procedures.




<u>**Quarantine**</u> = when you have been exposed but you are not experiencing symptoms



Isolation = when you are experiencing symptoms or have a confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 (tested positive) Updated 10/27/2021

Return to school after no fever for 24 hours without using fever reducing medications & other symptoms have improved






UNTIIL NO fever for 24 hours without fever reducing medication & other symptoms have improved



Protocols & Procedures

PAUSED AS OF DECEMBER 8, 2021

Screen & Stay applies to students or staff who are unvaccinated or partially vaccinated and were exposed to COVID-19 while in school. **NOTE: This does not apply to before/after school programs <u>UNLESS</u> they are** controlled situations such as tutoring or classroom style learning.

These individuals are choosing to continue to report to school for in-person learning or work provided exposure occurred:

Inside the school building between masked individuals Between either masked or unmasked individuals in certain supervised outdoor activities at school

The student/staff person identified as a close contact remains asymptomatic





Both the school and family can implement selected procedures to further reduce inschool transmission risk.

SCREEN & STAY

Requirements



Perform a daily symptom assessment for 14 calendar days.



Provide a documented affirmation to their school health office, administration, or other designee.



The person will quarantine at home and not report to school if they experience any of the COVID-19 symptoms during any time of the 14-day monitoring period.

THESE GUIDELINES DO NOT APPLY WHEN INDIVIDUALS ARE NOT IN SCHOOL



Screen & Stay does not apply to:

- PreK students and staff
- having a close contact outside of school (e.g. parties, sports, play dates, etc)
- in a situation indoors where masks were removed and 6 feet of spacing was not maintained
- during extracurricular or other activities outside the regular school day





INTERSCHOLASTIC, **YOUTH AND OTHER AMATEUR SPORT** ACTIVITIES

Those who are fully vaccinated athletes, coaches, officials and other participants:

- on December 23, 2021

CT DPH COVID-19 Guidance

• no longer need to quarantine after an exposure

• do not need to be included in regular screening testing

• can actively compete (in-game) without a mask starting

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
