With this victory, the Chemics improve to an impressive 8-5-1

Boys Varsity Basketball: The Chemics faced a tough challenge Tuesday night, as they were overpowered by the Hawks, ultimately falling 83-39. The game began with a slow start for the Chemics, who quickly found themselves trailing 24-6 at the end of the first quarter.
