Greetings Division of Early Childhood Families,

We hope this letter finds your family healthy and well. Thank you for registering your child in advance of yesterday's COVID testing at DEC. The importance to prior registration for testing is so that the confirmation code generated with your registration coincides with your child's name. Tests without a confirmation code will not be accepted by the lab.

What follows this page is a sample form of what your child will be taking home on Friday, February 25. The form is for you to complete with the registration information and to be returned to your child's teacher by March 2, 2022.

Our next COVID test clinic at DEC for children ages 2 and up will take place **March 8, 8:00 a.m.** – **10:00 a.m.** in the PRC. We continue to follow the LDoE School Re-entry Plan, which does not allow for parents/guardians to be in our buildings. If you prefer to be present with your child for testing, or you feel that your child will not test in your absence, you have the option of taking your child to the Mesita Complex for testing, by appointment only. The recommendation is that if you choose this option, to please have your child tested at Mesita on the same day as DEC is testing. This way, your child remains on the same test schedule as all DEC children.

As a reminder, students who are dropped off curbside, will begin with a temp check, followed by a health screen. Once completed, students will be assisted out of the vehicle by DEC staff and taken to the PRC for testing. DEC staff will also be tested on this day.

A friendly reminder to adults at bus stops and in vehicles at curbside is that LDoE continues to have a mask mandate in place. If you are not wearing a mask, DEC staff will respectfully ask you to please put on your mask. Please note that staff are simply following COVID Safe community and district policy practices. We appreciate your compliance.

As per Governor Kowemy's Emergency Public Health Order School Testing for Community Safety dated 02/01/22, all staff and students are to test weekly and then move to every other week. The order can be found on the POL website https://www.lagunapueblo-nsn.gov/

Our next COVID test clinic at DEC will be Tuesday, March 8, 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m. Please register your child on the NMDOH website https://cvtestreg.nmhealth.org/ using the Laguna location and the test date of 03/08/22. Once you register your child you will receive a confirmation code. This code is needed to process your child's test sample that is collected on campus.

If you prefer to be present with your child for testing, or you feel that your child will not test in your absence, you have the option of taking your child to the Mesita Complex for testing, by appointment only. The recommendation is that if you choose this option, to please have your child tested at Mesita on the same day as DEC is testing. This way, your child remains on the same test schedule as all DEC children.

Thank you to all families that participated in the Father-Daughter, Mother-Son Dance. We had lots of fun!

We are now back with in-person learning. The DEC program makes safety and engaging learning environments top priority for all children's learning.

I continue to be available to all DEC enrolled families that may have concerns or questions regarding your child's learning whether learning through virtual sessions or if your child is now back in-person

Tips for Parents:

Using the child's home environment as a "Teaching Tool" can be easy and rewarding for children and simple, with no major expense for families. For example kitchens have many objects that are safe and can be handled by children for a hands-on experience. There are many benefits to using home-made sensory boxes for children. Some of the ways it assists with children's development are:

*Promotes communication skills by developing language, attaching words to objects *helps develop children's fine motor (small hand muscles), * Promotes alertness and brain function, *Boosts self-esteem and well-being, * and promotes academic skills like counting, identifying colors, shapes.

At-Home Activity



Depending on the age of your child/children:

Make a Sensory Box –for exploration and learning fun.

Sensory boxes can be made by closing up a box and cutting out a space big enough for your child's hand to reach in and pull out objects like, a clean towel, a spoon, a large serving spoon, a plastic cup, a small securely sealed bag of Jell-O pieces. This gives children sensory experiences, adults can use words to describe colors, shapes, use counting, words that describe textures,


Welcome back to school!
