Section V: Report of Progress Narrative

Dietrich School District showed great improvement in profeciency and growth in the IRI as well as the ISAT math scores. These are two areas that we had identified that needed improvement. Dietrich Schools was ranked 3rd in the state in the percent of students showing growth on the IRI. They aslo were ranked 9th in the state for students being at grade level for reading at 79 percent of students. The 3-8 and 11th grade math scores were well above the state average. The state average was 42.2 % Dietrich average on 3-8 and 11 th grade was 57.4%. This is a little bit low from what we had set as a goal for our math students. We will continue to work and make improvements to acheive the goal we have set for the district. As a whole the district has seen adequate growth in all areas. We will still be focusing on Proficiency in a few areas for ELA and Math We will be implementing interim assessments as well as continuing to build math skills in all of our students to see significant gorwth in this area.
