Class Description

In chorus, we grow together as a team while building important life skills like commitment, respect, discipline, and dependability. We'll learn the basics of music theory and apply them to create a strong, unified choral sound. Along the way, we'll explore music from a wide range of styles, cultures, languages, and backgrounds including both secular and sacred works. Most importantly, we'll work toward becoming the best ensemble we can be together.

Classroom Expectations (Non-Negotiables)

- 1. Be Respectful Speak kindly, listen actively, and support one another.
- 2. Be Responsible Follow directions, stay in your seat, and come prepared.
- 3. Be Self-Driven Give your best effort, stay focused, and participate fully.
- 4. Be Performance Ready No gum, food, or distractions—keep your voice and space clear to sing your best.

Daily Chorus Vibes

Follow these simple habits every day to keep us on track and sounding great.

- **Enter with Purpose:** Come in calmly and get ready to rehearse.
- Bring What You Need: Music & Sight-Reading Folder, Sharpened pencil, and Positive attitude
- Go to Your Spot: Sit in your assigned seat unless told otherwise.
- Save the Talking: Stay focused—your voice is what matters most!
- **Sing Every Time:** This is a singing class. Everyone participates, every day!

Discipline Policy

To keep our classroom focused, respectful, and performance-ready, we follow these steps when expectations aren't met:

1. Friendly reminder (nonverbal, written, or verbal)

- 2. **Behavior reflection** (quick written response or conversation)
- 3. Parent contact and/or Spotlight referral

- 4. Choral probation (may result in missing a performance, trip, or activity)
- 5. **Office referral** if behavior continues or is severe

We may adjust steps based on the situation.

Trips and Off Campus Performances

Chorus trips are performance-based learning experiences beyond the classroom. Participation is a privilege, not a guarantee. Students with behavior issues or failing grades may be removed from a trip or performance. All school rules apply, and consequences are handled by the Choral Director and/or school administration.

Attendance Policy

Performances, Practices, and After-School Rehearsals

- 1. Concerts are a required part of chorus. Missing a performance is strongly discouraged.
- 2. All concerts and dress rehearsals are mandatory.
- 3. After-school rehearsals will only be scheduled if class goals aren't met.
- 4. Excused absences are only allowed for emergencies or with prior written approval.
- 5. Excused reasons include:
 - o Personal illness (with a parent note)
 - Death in the family
 - Approved written excuse (submitted before the event)
- 6. **Missed performances must be made up** with an assignment due within 7 days, posted on Canvas under "Missed Work."
- 7. If an emergency arises, contact Mr. Young via school phone, email, or school app before the concert.
- 8. For scheduling conflicts with other school activities:
 - Avoid conflicts when possible—check the chorus calendar regularly.
 - Games/performances take priority over practices/rehearsals, with advance notice.
 - Let the director and coach communicate directly to resolve conflicts.

Performance and rehearsal dates will be shared well in advance, typically one month before performances and two weeks before rehearsals. A full calendar is included in this handbook.
