Dear Parishioners,

I am grateful to share that I have finally received a shipment of my book. After giving some copies away, I now have a limited number available for direct purchase: about 10 hardcover editions and 20 paperback editions.

The paperback will be available for \$15, and the hardcover for \$20. Because of the higher cost, I do not plan to order additional hardcovers once these are gone, but I will continue to purchase more paperbacks as needed.

It is also my intention to provide a copy for every priest of the Diocese. One of the printers I am working with allows me to include a personalized page for special orders, which I plan to take advantage of. With the sales that have already come in, along with the books I have on hand, I expect to essentially break even after covering expenses such as ISBNs (four were needed—for paperback, hardcover, Kindle, and EPUB), the website, and other publishing costs.

I did not write this book to raise money. I wrote it because I deeply believe the message is needed today—that mercy and justice are not opposed, that forgiveness is essential, and that healing is possible in Christ. These truths are often misunderstood, and my prayer is that this book will help bring clarity and hope. I may never see all the fruits of this work, but I entrust it to God, asking Him to use it for His good purposes.

Thanks be to God, the renovation project at St. Edward's is nearing completion. On Sunday, September 14, Bishop Zielinski will celebrate Mass with us at 9:30 am, as we formally return to the church from the basement.

I am hopeful the refinished pews will be in place, but because of the Festival that weekend, we will celebrate in the church even if we must use folding chairs. To accommodate Bishop's schedule, I will also offer an earlier Mass at St. Eloi at 7:30 am that morning.

Please be sure to note the time and location changes on your calendars.
