



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

CHANGE OF ADDRESS / DATA CONFIRMATION

If your address has changed, please update your information in the school Records Office. **Data Confirmation is required for all returning students.** Parents and guardians please visit the <u>Aeries Portal</u> site and login with your email and password. If your phone numbers, emergency or personal information changes throughout the school year, please update your information in the school Records Office or by visiting the Aeries Portal. It is very important that we have current contact information in order for us to successfully send out school messages and alert you in case of an emergency.

CLASSROOM INTERRUPTIONS

Messages from parents or guardians during class time will be limited to emergencies only with administrator approval. We are committed to preserving the integrity of instruction and do not interrupt classes to call students out for personal deliveries. Items left for pickup are done so at own risk. Parents are welcome to come during passing periods to have their student paged.

CLOSED CAMPUS / VISITOR POLICY

PVHS is a closed campus between 8 am and 4 pm. As per Board Policy (AR 6116 and BP1250), only pre-arranged visitors are allowed on campus during the school day. Lunchtime activities/assemblies are for current students. Parents and other visitors are not allowed at these closed events. Students are not permitted to bring visitors. Administration reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone.

DRESS CODE

Requirements apply to all students, as provided in the Education Code and/or District Policy. They are:

- 1. No attire including clothing, jewelry, hats or personal items:
 - may promote or advertise drugs, alcohol or tobacco use.
 - · depict obscenity or lewdness.
 - be inflammatory with regard to race, religion or heritage.
 - may promote gang affiliation (nor pro sports teams)
 - only hats with PV logos permitted
- 2. Feet must be covered, minimally, providing protection to the bottom of the foot. (PE requires tennis shoes for safe participation in activities.)
- 3. The upper torso must be covered. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times. See-through or fishnet fabrics, halter tops, spaghetti straps (must be two inches wide), off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops, bare midriffs and skirts/shorts shorter than mid-thigh are prohibited.
- 4. Pajamas and slippers are not appropriate school apparel.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones may be carried by students, but will be confiscated if they disrupt the educational process. If a phone is confiscated from the student, a parent / guardian will be required to pick it up from the Assistant Principal. The school is not financially responsible for any lost or stolen items.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students must maintain a 2.0 "C" grade point average to be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities. Eligibility is determined at the end of each six-week grading period.

EXCUSING ABSENCES

Parents will be allowed to report and clear absences within two (2) school days of the absences one of several ways:

- By phone
- By email
- By written note
- Via the website link
- Walk-ins

When notifying the school of your student's absence, please include the following information:

- Student's first and last name
- Grade
- ID number
- Date and reason for absence
- Parent/Guardian name
- Relationship to the student
- Phone number where you can be reached

PLEASE NOTE: Per District policy, upon 14 or more days of excused absences, we request that any future absences be verified by a physician in the form of a note.

ID CARDS

Students are to carry their ID cards at all times. ID cards are used to verify that a student belongs on campus, to check out textbooks, library materials, laptop or PE loaners. The first card is free; each card after is \$3 paid at the Business Office.

LEAVING CAMPUS DURING THE DAY

Parents / guardians who need to take their student out of school during the day **must be prepared to show identification at the Attendance Office.** Only those persons listed on the student's medical emergency information will be allowed to take the student from school. The school appreciates every effort made by parents to schedule appointments outside of the school day.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

To be considered in **good standing** and determine your privilege in participating in extra-curricular activities including sporting events, club performances, dances, Grad Night and graduation ceremonies, students should have:

- •No major discipline issues
- •No outstanding ASB, library, textbook or tablet charges "IF YOU OWE, YOU DON'T GO."
- •No more than 6 period cuts for every three weeks that school is in session "NO SHOW...NO GO."
- Must be on track to graduate.

TOBACCO-FREE SCHOOL

The use of all tobacco products including e-cigarettes and vaping devices is prohibited on campus and at school events.

WITHDRAWAL FROM CLASSES

Students who drop a course during the first 20 school days of the semester, may do so without any entry on his/her permanent record. A student who drops a course after 20 school days of enrollment in a class shall receive an "F" on their permanent record unless otherwise decided by the principal or designee because of extenuating circumstances .

An easy to use cloud-based learning management system empowering teachers and students with countless tools. Parents will be able to create an account that allows them access to their student's information and to communicate with teachers.

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CANVAS MAKES TEACHING & LEARNING EASY FOR EVERYONE!

Canvas allows **TEACHERS** to provide online content to students in an organized and easy to use fashion with ways to create and deliver content, monitor student participation, and assess student performance.

STUDENTS can submit work, and utilize interactive features such as threaded discussions, video conferencing, and discussion forums using the device in a way they are most used to.

As a **PARENT**, you can create a Canvas login that will allow you to check on upcoming assignments, view class materials and follow your student's progress. To do so, you will need to know:

Welcome SMJUHSD families to another school year!

We are pleased to announce that the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District will continue participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2023-2024 school year.

Will I need to submit a meal application to receive free meals? No, Under California Universal Meals, all enrolled students are eligible to receive one healthy breakfast and lunch free of charge every schoolday. However, although meals are free of charge, we kindly request that your household submit a Household Income Data Survey online by September 30th, 2023 at Household Income Form.

Why do I need to submit a survey if meals are free? The information collected ensures maximum student support services for our student(s). Our schools receive additional State and Federal funding to support supplemental education programs and services. Your family may receive additional benefits such as college admissions test and application fee waivers and home internet discounts.
