Vigor High School and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) (participating children), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

School Responsibilities

Vigor High School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

- Ensure that teachers are using local and state standards when planning instruction for their students.
- Provide ongoing professional development for teachers and staff to ensure the classroom is conducive for learning.
- Promote the use of differentiated instruction to ensure that each child's learning needs are met.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

- Conferences will be scheduled during Open House which is held September 2023.
- Teachers will hold the parent-teacher conferences once between the months of September and December and again between the months of January and March.
- Teachers will also be required to hold a Partnership Conference to review each individual student's results on 2022 Pre-ACT and/or ACT. This conference must be held on or before December 2023.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

- Information will be distributed via phone messages, student email, school website, and teacher bulletins.
- Teachers will be required to provide parents with progress reports every two weeks and a report card each quarter.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- Staff will be available to parents during their scheduled planning periods.
- Parents may email teachers from school website at vigorhighschool.com
- Parents may call the school to leave messages for the staff.
- Teachers are available before and after school by appointment only.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Parents may volunteer to serve on the Parent Advisory Committee (PAC).
- Parents may volunteer to serve on the Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) Committee to express academic decision-making concerns and suggestions.
- Parents may volunteer to serve on extracurricular activity committees.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

- Utilize resources provided by the district's ELL department.
- Solicit help from the ELL department to communicate with parent and students.
- TransACT program will be used to convert school information into the student's home language.

Parent Responsibilities

- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
