
December Student of the Month: Jackson Moran



TK and Kindergarten

In reading, Kindergarteners are learning to read consonant clusters like clap, snap, swim, and step. In this unit, students also start to read little readers that contain short stories. TK just started their plant unit. They will learn about the parts of a plant and how plants grow. TK is also learning to recognize the beginning sounds of words and about the letter A. Both grades continue to work on rhyming and identifying patterns.


